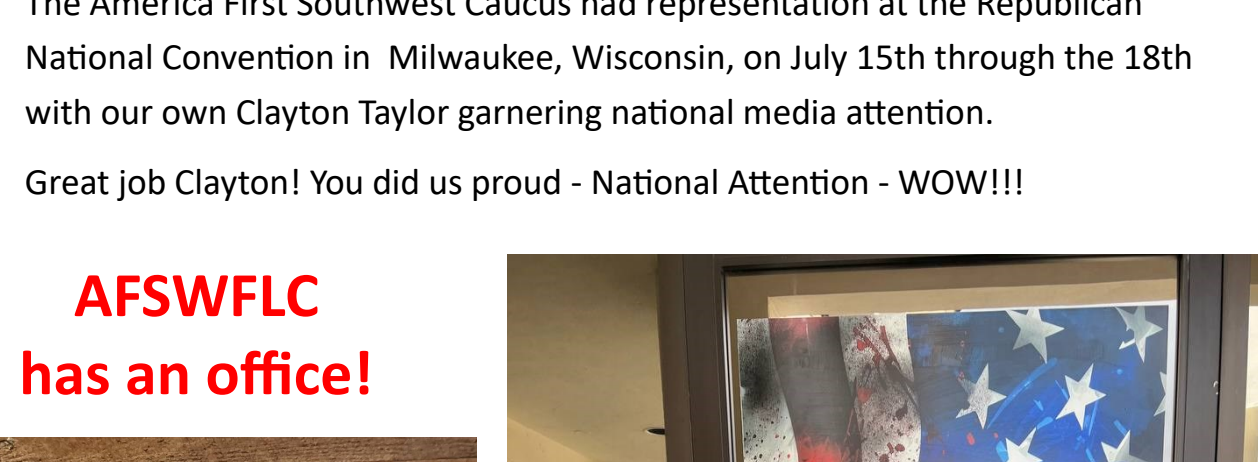

Guest speakers in August will be: The Sarasota Memorial Hospital candidates will join us for their views on how they want to impact the board.

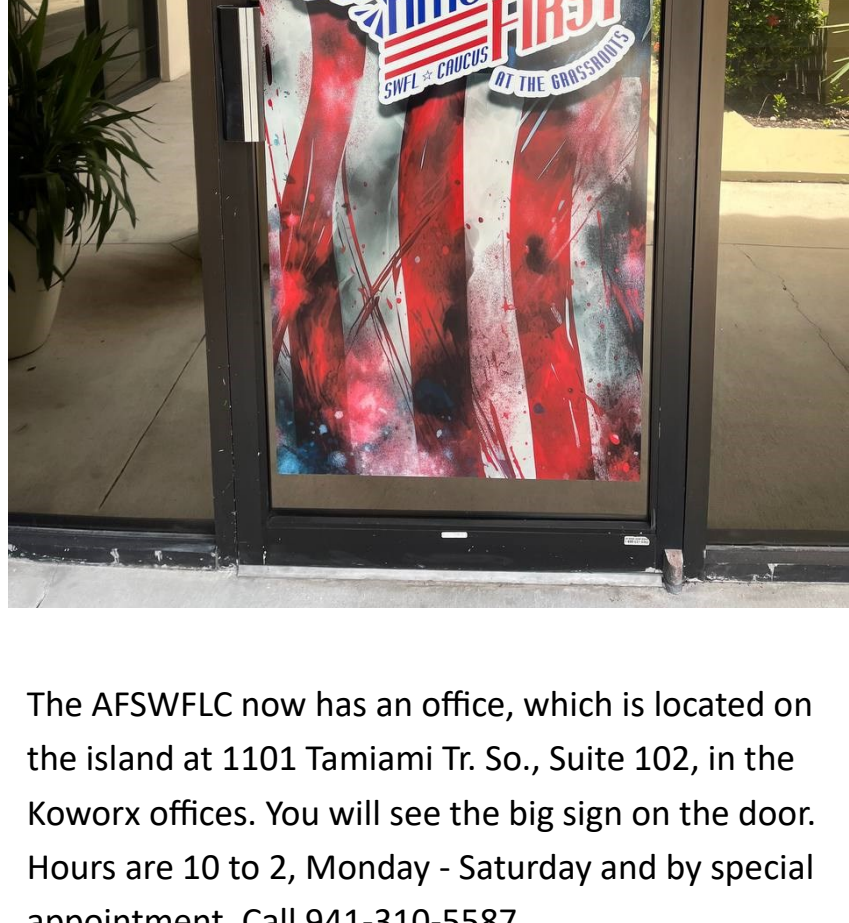
Our next meeting is August 14, 2024, 11 am-1 pm at the Venice Community Center, 326 S. Nokomis Ave.

Sarasota Republican Candidate Rally 2024

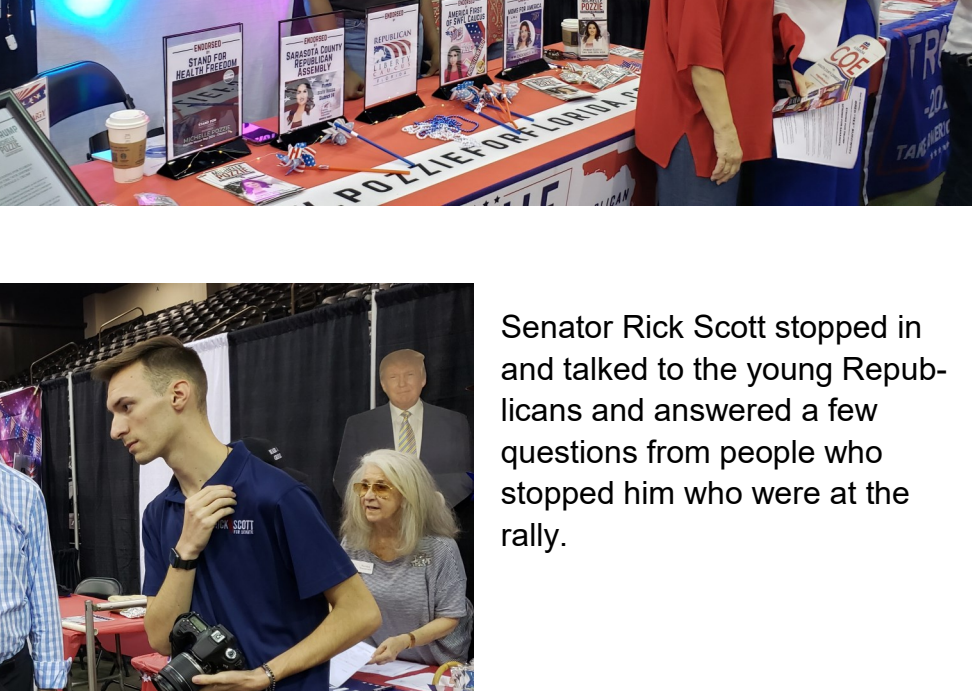

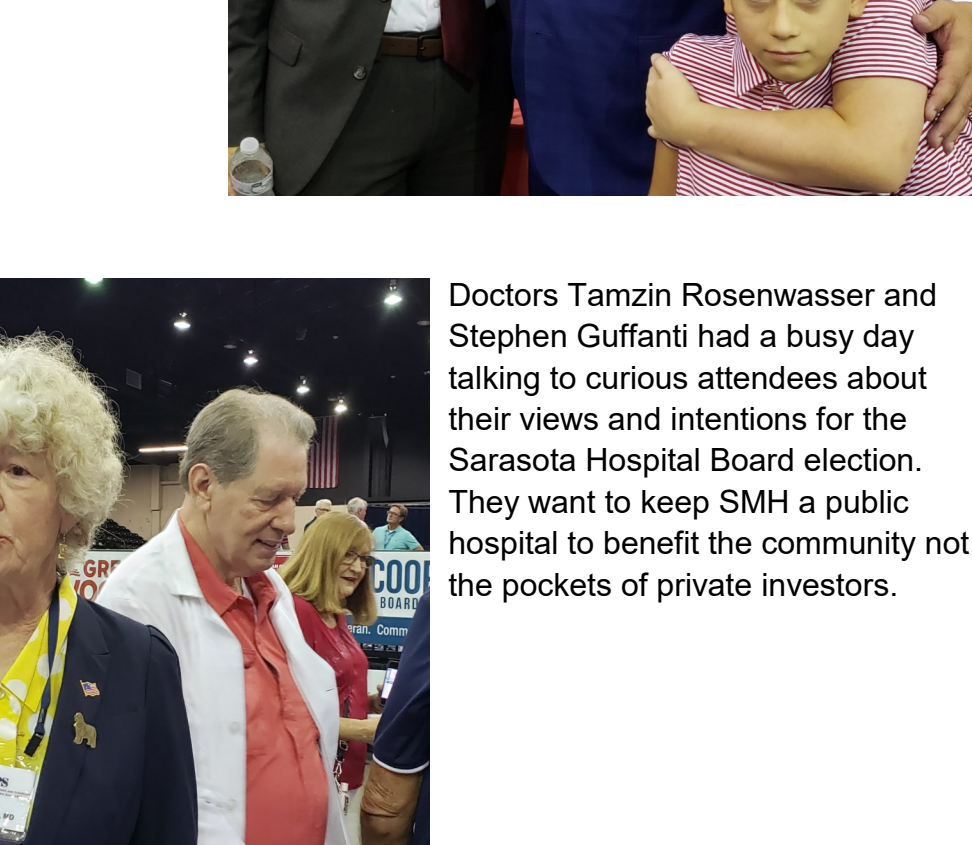


Senator Rick Scott stopped in and talked to the young Republicans and answered a few questions from people who stopped him who were at the rally.

Dad joke: When a FL House representative says he stands on his record, he means that literally—to keep you from checking it.



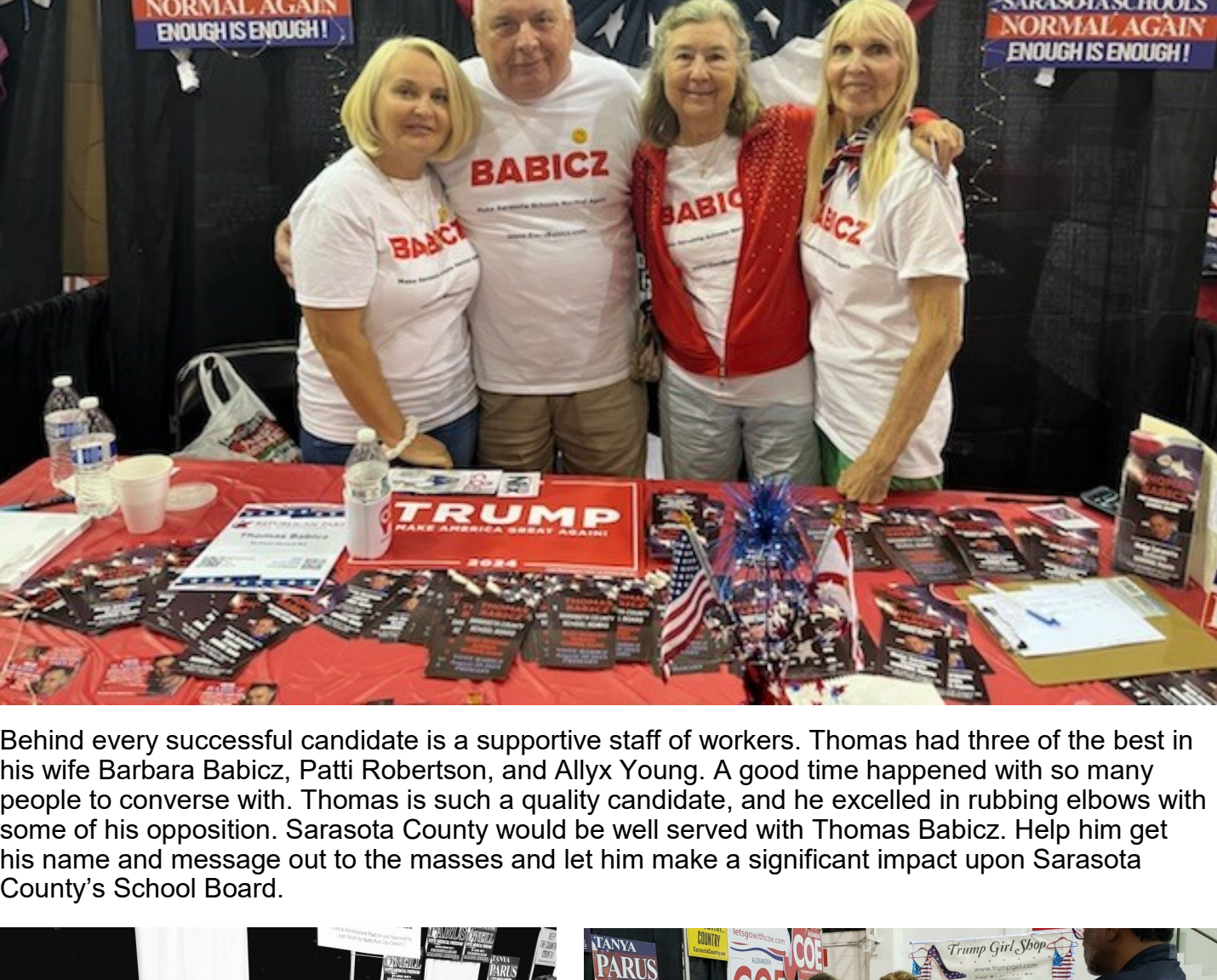

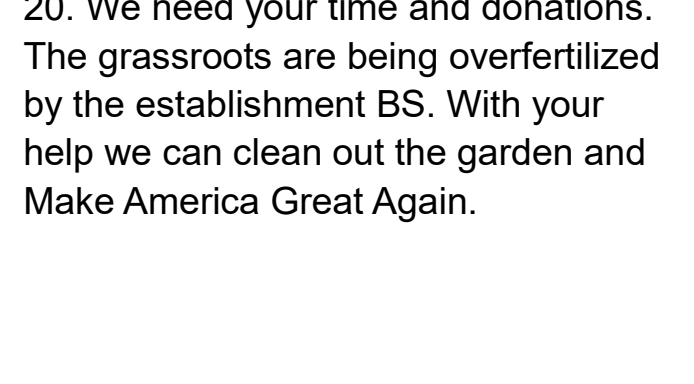

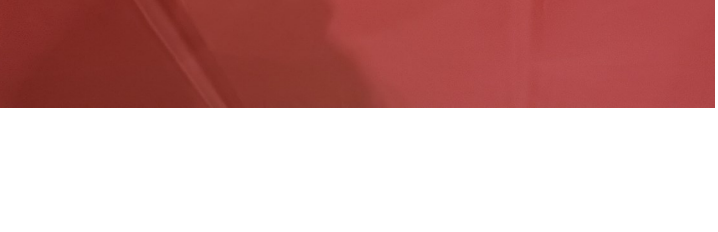
