Meet Dolores

Growing up as a “Border Child” has profoundly influenced Dolores Alvarado’s lifetime of leadership in the community health movement. Her family emigrated from Cd. Juarez in Chihuahua, México, to El Paso, Texas, when she was just 5 years old. By the time she was 7, her family was working in the Fresno agricultural fields. They later migrated to the Bay Area, working in the canneries and subsequently settling in San Francisco.



By age 10, Dolores had taken on the role of an interpreter on doctor visits, filling out job applications, and translating legal paperwork for her parents and other family members. These early experiences with government and health care systems planted a seed in Dolores for **lifting up poorly-resourced communities** and providing them with access to a better, healthier life.

Her parents believed education is the door to liberation, and this inspired Dolores to earn a **Master of Social Welfare (MSW)** and a **Master in Public Health (MPH)**, both from **UC Berkeley**. She has gone on to lead equitable public health efforts in Alameda and Santa Clara Counties for nearly 50 years.



Dolores currently serves as **CEO of Community Health Partnership**, a 33-year-old nonprofit membership-based coalition of community health centers advocating for quality, affordable, accessible, and culturally competent health care systems. She is a graduate of **Leadership Morgan Hill** (2010) and the **American Leadership Forum** (2014), and serves as a Governing Board Member of the **Santa Clara Family Health Plan**.

Throughout her professional career, Dolores has demonstrated an unparalleled ability to work with government, private philanthropy, and community to **get things done**. Her boundless work ethic and integrity have made her the most trusted resource for immigrant community health in our region.
