Junior Players Code of Conduct

Pudsey Saint Lawrence Cricket Club (PSLCC) wants all junior players to enjoy cricket in a *safe, fun and respectful environment*.

All junior players are expected to follow this Code of Conduct when training, playing matches or representing the club.

Play Fair

- Play by the rules of cricket.
 - Always try your best and play in the spirit of the game.
 - Accept the decisions of umpires, coaches and team captains.

Respect Everyone

- Treat teammates, coaches, officials, volunteers and opponents with respect.
 - Encourage and support other players.
 - Do not bully, tease, swear at or abuse anyone.

Listen and Learn

- Listen carefully to coaches and follow instructions.
 - Work as part of a team and help others improve.
 - Respect the facilities and equipment provided by the club.

Stay Safe

- Play safely and follow instructions designed to protect players.

- Always wear the correct *cricket safety equipment* when required (including helmets, pads, gloves and other protective gear when batting, wicketkeeping or fielding in close positions).
 - Tell a coach or responsible adult if equipment is damaged or unsafe.

Training and Supervision

- Junior players *must not train or practise at the club without a responsible adult or club coach present*, especially outside normal training sessions.
 - Always let a coach or responsible adult know before leaving training or matches.

Speak Up

- Tell a coach, parent, welfare officer or trusted adult if something makes you feel uncomfortable, worried or unsafe.
 - Help create a safe and positive environment for everyone.

Have Fun

- Enjoy playing cricket and encourage others to enjoy it too.
 - Celebrate effort, improvement and teamwork — not just winning.

Remember:

Cricket should always be *fun, safe and respectful for everyone involved*.
