Elementary Options

The Tuesday and Thursday hybrid program has 9am start time. Math, language arts, science, and social studies end at 130pm. Students in this program pick TWO elective hours each week to be included in tuition. Additional hours at \$50/ month each. Students not enrolled in the hybrid program MAY enroll in electives at the same rate plus supplies and registration fees but they may not enroll in the hybrid only academic courses from 9am-130pm on Tuesday and Thursday. Registration NON-HYBRID \$75/per child

Supplies are \$25/each class/per semester / per child

Tuition for classes meeting once a week for one hour are \$250/semester or \$50/month payments Jan 1 - May 1.

Tuition for classes meeting once a week for two hours are \$500/semester or \$100/month payments Jan 1 - May 1.

If you would like to register your child for the whole day on Monday or Wednesday from 9am-130pm, the tuition is discounted to \$175/ month payments for Jan 1 - May 1 for the semester term.

If you would like to register your child for Monday and Wednesday from 9-130, the tuition is discounted to \$325/month payments for Jan 1 - May 1 for the semester term.

We apologize but hybrid students may not enroll in Monday, Wednesday, or Friday electives instead of Tuesday/ Thursday options. These can be added on at a discount rate to hybrid students but cannot take the place of the ones included in tuition on Tue and Thur.

Homework Help for grades 2- 5 on Monday and Wednesday.

Certified teachers are ready to assist students in any subject area whether it was assigned by CHR classes or by mom/dad at home. The hours are 9-230. Monday or Wednesday only is \$100/month for hybrid students and \$125/ month for non hybrid students for Jan- May. Monday and Wednesday is \$200/ month for hybrid students and \$250/month for non hybrid students. Payments are made Jan 1 - May 1 .

All classes are priced on a semester commitment.

Class Descriptions for Friday Enrichment 2018

ART Masterpieces

Students will create their own masterpieces while experimenting with art principles and elements alongside learning the history and culture of many famous artists. Various mediums will be used to create works of art such as, but not limited to, clay, paint, plaster, stencils, papier-mâché, watercolors, and oil pastels.

Reading & Writing Enrichment

Students at all levels will greatly enjoy reading high-interest, age appropriate materials as they create their own unique stories, poetry, and nonfiction writings. They will learn the writing process, story elements, and improve their reading and writing skills at all levels. Students will play a variety of creative games and activities to enhance their reading and writing understandings. For K-2nd grade students, hands-on activities will be based on phonics, sight words, and fun with poetry, creative writing, and nonfictional writings. Students in grades 3rd-6th students' activities will include word analysis, literary devices, poems, short stories, reading for meaning, and creative and nonfiction writing.

Fitness Fun

Students will have super active fun- moving, stretching, mastering self-made obstacle courses and circuit routines, playing organized games, and even learning some yoga and dance moves.

Fun French

Using songs, crafts, games, reading, writing, listening, speaking, and other fun activities French students will explore the 5 C's of foreign language education: Communication,

Culture, Connections, Comparisons, and Community. Students will learn basic phrases, vocabulary, and conversational French.

STEAM

Students will learn new skills and principles while engaging in age appropriate, hands-on activities to implement Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematic fundamentals. While having fun, students will be enhancing their creative thinking, problem solving, and team building skills. Some examples of activities are learning about surface tension by building boats, making greenhouses to observe seed growth, and creating stethoscopes to listen and record our heart beats.

Project Based Learning-

Students will learn new skills as they engage in active exploration, critical thinking, collaboration, communication, research, and problem solving while completing real world tasks such as designing board games, creating brochures and posters, producing videos or plays, and conducting interviews. Topics will be determined by the interest of the students.

Brain Games and Educational Crafts

In this class, students will enjoy playing games and extra socializing with their friends while participating in a multitude of non-electronic games and activities such as Scrabble, Battleship, Headbands, Chess, trivia, and making crafts based on the holidays and seasons.

Quiz Bowl-

Students in second grade to seventh grade will play on teams to answer questions and earn little prizes for great participation, earning the most points, and showing sportsmanship. Questions will be based on a wide variety of academic subjects and will vary in difficulty so that all students will experience some successes. Students will have a lot of fun while learning and reviewing topics and vocabulary commonly seen in their grade level studies and standardized tests.

*Musical Theater- Come work on your dramatic arts talents with Mrs. Ann, our classically trained chorus teacher. We are preparing for our spring performance variety show.

Program Costs-

For Hybrid CHR Students-

Registration fee is \$25 (non-refundable, paid once per school year)

Supply fee is \$50 per school semester for full day program or \$20 per individual class

Tuition is \$110 for full day (4 classes) or

\$50 per individual class, paid monthly for 5 months from December 1st -April 1st.

Siblings' cost is \$65 a month for 5 months.

(There is a discount of \$45 per month off the tuition cost for the second and subsequent siblings of hybrid students.)

For Non-Hybrid Students-

Registration fee is \$25 (non-refundable, paid once per school year)

Supply fee is \$50 for full day program or \$20 per individual class (non-refundable paid once per semester)

Tuition is \$50 per individual class or \$145 for full day (4 classes), paid monthly for 5 months from December 1st -April 1st.

Sibling discounted price- Second sibling is \$95 a month tuition for 5 months. Third and subsequent siblings are \$65 monthly for 5 months.

*Musical Theater-

\$25 registration fee paid once a year (nonrefundable) and tuition is \$30 a month for elementary students. Middle and high school students have longer hours and fees (please see our middle and high school guide)

Payments can be made by cash or check in person, mailing a check or money order, or online or using a credit or debit card. Online, debit or credit card payments will have a 3% processing fee added.
