Class Descriptions for Friday Enrichment Program Classes Fall 2020

ART Masterpieces

Students will create their own masterpieces while experimenting with art principles and elements alongside learning the history and culture of many famous artists. Various mediums will be used to create works of art such as, but not limited to, clay, paint, plaster, stencils, papier-mâché, watercolors, and oil pastels.

Fitness Fun and Unplugged Gaming

Students will have super active fun- moving, stretching, mastering self-made obstacle courses and circuit routines, playing organized (non-electronic) games, and even learning some yoga and dance moves. This class helps build cooperation, teamwork, and sportsmanship.

History through Dramatic Play, Games, and Crafts

In this class, students will enjoy learning history thorough dramatic play, crafting and playing games based on high-interest historical people, places, and events.

Learning History with American Girl Dolls-

Encouraged by a love for American girl dolls, students will learn American history, geography, and culture. They will do fun activities, games, crafts, and even some cooking all coordinated with their learning about lives and times of the American Girl dolls. Families are encouraged to read along the American Girl books at home (not provided.) We will learn about the lives and historical context of Samantha Parkington (1904). Rebecca Rubin (1914), Kit Kittredge (1934), Julie Albright (1974).

Lego Challenge Builds and Robotics-

Brick lovers will use Legos, Lego Software, and Lego Movie Making to design and build their own creations and make them come life with sound and motion. Some of the robotic projects include a remote-controlled rover, a helicopter, and a dump truck. Students will be challenged to build catapults that shoot marshmallows, ziplines for their minifigures, marble mazes, bridges, towers, and a lot more!

Literature & Writing Fun

Students at all levels will greatly enjoy reading high-interest, age appropriate materials as they create their own unique stories, poetry, fiction and non-fiction writings. They will learn the writing process, story elements, and improve their reading and writing skills at all levels.

Students will play a variety of creative games and activities to enhance their reading and writing understandings. For K-2nd grade students, hands-on activities will be based on fun with phonic skills, poetry, creative writing, and nonfictional writings. Students in grades 3rd-7th students' activities will include word analysis, literary devices, poems, short stories, and creative and nonfiction writing.

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***Musical Theater for K-7th**

There is a part or position for every child as they sing, dance, and learn about backstage production while preparing for a holiday production in December (will include Christian content) and a spring show. Exact show dates and program details to be decided based on enrollment numbers each semester. Musical Theater is an additional \$25 per month and \$25 registration fee.

Project Based Learning-

Students will learn new cross-curricular skills and teamwork as they engage in active exploration, critical thinking, collaboration, communication, research, and problem solving while completing real world tasks such as designing board games, helping with charity drives, creating brochures and posters, producing videos or plays, and conducting interviews. Example projects include planning a food truck business with model, creating a fictional theme park, and coordinating and advertising school charity initiatives.

STEAM

Students will learn new skills and principles while engaging in age appropriate, hands-on activities to implement Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematic fundamentals. While having fun, students will be enhancing their creative thinking, problem solving, and team building skills. Some examples of activities are learning about buoyancy by building boats, constructing simple machines such as ramps and pulleys to complete jobs, and creating solar ovens to learn about alternative forms of energy. Program Costs-

Registration fee is \$50 (non-refundable, paid once per school year)

Supply fee is \$100 for the full year, full day program or \$20 per individual class.

Tuition is \$150 for full day (5 classes) or \$30 per individual class, paid monthly for 10 months from July 1 to April 1, 2021.

Siblings' cost, with discount, is \$100 a month for 10 months or \$20 a month per class.

**Elementary Musical Theater is an additional \$50 per month and the registration fee is \$25.*

Students attending 4 Friday classes and Musical Theater would have a tuition cost of \$170 a month and siblings would be \$130 a month.

Payments can be made by cash or check in person, mailing a check or money order, or online or using a credit or debit card. Online, debit or credit card payments will have a 4% processing fee added.
