RESEARCH AND PROGRAMS

During a typical year Global Environmental Health LAB has a robust field research program for students and young professionals looking to expand their research skills. A select group of research scholars are chosen to participate in an intensive international program in Southeast Asia, where they immerse themselves in local institutions and gain exposure to new cultures, research approaches, and public health challenges. This immersive experience is designed to build capacity for our local partners while providing collaborative global health research experience to all participants. The program encompasses much more than the weeks we spend in the field as the projects and collaborations are ongoing, and the memories and friendships last a lifetime. Participants use the research training to propel their academic development as GEH LAB helps scholars submit work for presentation and publication, and build their CVs.

This year was anything but typical. Though we could not run the field program in 2021, we are already gearing up for our 2022 program in Indonesia! In 2020 and 2021, the research program was overhauled to ensure that we could safely engage in collaborative research and capacity building efforts. Efforts turned to creating productive fully virtual relationships with our partners, staff and interns. We were still able to provide meaningful opportunities including our first fully virtual International Symposium for Sustainable Development and virtual internships and research training to students from across the United States. The pandemic didn't stop the momentum of ongoing research projects, we were able to adjust methods or use data collected during prior field research programs to advance the following projects during 2021:

- Access to Services and Quality of Life for Children with Disabilities in Myanmar
- Prevalence, Policies, Practices and Norms Surrounding Antibiotic Resistant Diseases in Indonesia
- Occupational and Environmental Exposures to Volatile Organic Compounds in a Hand-dug Petroleum Extraction Site
- Impact of Natural Disasters on Mental Health Outcomes of First Responders in Central Myanmar
- Health Risk Perceptions Related to Mercury Use in Artisanal Mining Sites in Myanmar

SUSTAINABLE GALS

Much of GEH LAB's work involves sharing research and innovative ideas, connecting with others, and providing professional development opportunities for students and young professionals. Academic conferences and symposia bring all those factors together to create meaningful experiences for all involved. Our partners around the world, especially in Myanmar, were feeling the effects of COVID-19. They were suffering from deep personal loss and illness while also lacking the normal professional and academic opportunities for sharing their public health knowledge and advocacy. GEH LAB reached out to assess how we could fill a gap, and ultimately decided that we would bring an event to them.

That event became our fully virtual symposium: the 2021 6th International Symposium for Sustainable Development. The theme - The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and International Youth Day. Taking place via free online technology, participants had the ability to stay safe in their homes while sharing their knowledge and learning from experts and peers alike.

Anyone anywhere could submit an abstract for consideration and registration fees went toward supporting Myanmar scholars through this difficult time. The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are intertwined with the work and approach of GEH LAB promoting a healthier, safer and more livable world for us and future generations. All abstract submissions whether they focused on research, programs and education, or creative content (photos/videos/essays/art) - were linked to one of the 17 SDGs and many presentations highlighted the interconnected nature of the goals.

Each of the SDGs focuses on a specific aspect of sustainable development such as clean water, better infrastructure, peace and justice etc. and has associated targets and indicators so we can measure our progress locally and globally. Symposium presentations covered topics such as sustainable tourism, the global burden of blindness, antibiotic resistance, climate change, access to improved sanitation during natural disasters, and so much more.

The two-day symposium consisted of both live and asynchronous content presented by guest lecturers, professors, students, artists, and young professionals. Following the live conference all materials were archived online for those who missed the live proceedings.

To celebrate the work of students and young professionals, we assembled a group of current and former GEH LAB interns to convene "The International Youth Day Panel" and honored contributions to sustainable development through the Outstanding Youth and Young Professional Awards. The Youth Day panelists were asked questions about what it's like to grow up while experiencing the devastating impacts of climate change, how they contributing to achieving the SDGs in their communities, and what we can learn from youth to make progress toward a more sustainable tomorrow.


