All four children received post-college and terminal degrees. She saw her purpose and passion in assisting not only her own but anyone with whom she came in contact. Mary L. Cooper was a teacher, mentor, counselor, and excellent listener who used discussion and questioning skills to push the metacognitive and develop intuitive, creative, and self-thinkers of others.
