FROM THE PASTOR

Luke 2:14:

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace on earth among those whom God favors."

When we believe in God's truth and trust in the saving love of the Messiah, God is glorified and pleased. God finds "favor", with us. There is goodness and righteousness in all Creation and genuine peace at last. But don't just take my word for it: hear the angels sing.

The angels' Good News came to poor shepherds and through them, to a poor family, an unwed mother and father trying as best they could to provide shelter in a stable for their newborn son. The Gospel of Luke tells us that all who heard the words of the shepherds were amazed. Verse 20 concludes the stories of Jesus' birth and the first people who shared in the miracle;

"The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen."

In "The Magnificat" canticle of Luke 1:46-55, Mary sang of God's Good News to those aching for hope and peace, the disenfranchised, the powerless, the poor. Her song revealed God's intention to turn the world around:

"God scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly."

The birth of a Messiah was God's intervention in a world of suffering and fear. "Do not be afraid", an angel told the shepherds, and then the chorus sang.

Their nation lost, living under a dominating foreign power, the Jewish people yearned for peace. To them came salvation in Jesus. For those who believed in him, Jews and gentiles alike, there was new hope and new purpose, praise to God and Good News to tell. God's kingdom was revealed in Jesus and those who understood this knew the powerful of this world were dethroned by the Higher Power of Almighty God. As we sang in the carol, "Joy to the World":

"God rules the world with truth and grace and makes the nations prove the wonders of his love, the wonders of his love."


