FROM THE PASTOR

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

-Isaiah 43:19

Beneath the ground of the "Valley of Carroll's Delight" where I grew up in Pennsylvania, there is a vast aquifer, a seemingly endless supply of fresh, cool water that fills hidden limestone caverns. The water bubbles up on most every farm in the valley and feeds streams and ponds and eventually flows to the Susquehanna River, the Chesapeake Bay and the Atlantic Ocean. When a well was drilled for our new home in 1959, the drilling rig's boring bit let loose and fell into the watery abyss of the aquifer below. The well driller remarked, "Well, you'll never have to worry about running out of water!" He was right.

Ancient civilizations sprung up along water courses like the Nile and the Tigress-Euphrates River valley. People traveled along rivers and streams through desert areas and made their homes there. They dug channels in the dry earth so the water could flow into their fields.

In the Book of Genesis, we hear God charge the people of his new Creation to, "be fruitful, multiply and fill the earth." The plan was that people would be good stewards of the Creation and all the life it produced. But Eden was short-lived. Born in freedom, God's people could make their own choices. They haven't always been good ones. There have been dry spells. We're obviously in one now. We thirst for something better.

There's an ancient story of the people of Israel, released from bondage in Egypt, following Moses and wandering through a desert land, hoping for a better place and a better day. Desperate for water, they cry out to God and God provides. Moses strikes a rock with his walking staff and life giving-water rushes forth. The people are saved.

Where there is water, there is life. Where God's mercy pours forth, there is salvation.

Our theme for Lent is, "Streams in the Desert", and over these several weeks, the focus has been on the hope we find in Jesus Christ even when we travel through the sometimes parched, "desert land" of human turmoil and uncertainty. Christ's promise to us is that when we cry out to God, mercy flows, always, guaranteed. Easter is proof of this, the boundless gift of new life in the Risen Lord, poured out for our sake. This is the endless well of God's goodness and grace.

When the going gets rough, when human choices turn hearts away from God, when people trudge through desert places of fear and uncertainty, it is especially important, even vital, that those who know where the water is strike the rock, reveal the springs, drill the well. God's endless reservoir of mercy, love and peace is waiting and ready to give God's people new life, new direction to a better place and a better day.

Anticipate salvation, mercy so abundant you can drink your fill and find faith, strength and hope for your life. Easter comes, a New Thing even now springing up: "Do you not perceive it?"






Eddy House Dinners Tuesdays, April 8 & April 22

This year, the first full moon occurs on April 13. Easter, therefore, follows on Sunday, April 20. Ash Wednesday is a moveable feast which occurs forty-six days before Easter, this year,- March 5th..


