Wow – October already? I know, the leaves are turning color, the air is a little cooler, but still ... It sure does catch up to you. There are few chores I've been putting off, "until the weather gets cooler", but now that it's here I'm looking for new excuses! Of course, it's so good to be back in the swing of things for the fall church schedule – Sunday School, the Fall Meeting coming up and a little over a month away – All Saints Sunday ... then the holiday season approaches.

For the Hammett-Reed families, we close out September saying good-bye to Kay's mother, Beverly Reed. Her graveside service will be October 7 and Kay and I will be traveling to Pennsylvania October 6. We take with us our appreciation for your many prayers and kindnesses as Kay's mother endured an extended decline. As I write this, Mom has only been gone three days, so the loss and grief are just hitting home.

I began calling Beverly the "Energizer Bunny" because as the old battery advertisement went, she kept, "Going and going and going ..." Her mind left us some time ago, but her body wouldn't quit. She was 97.

As I am sure some of you know, after an extended illness and decline, death can sometimes bring relief as the burden of worry is lifted. There's is consolation in knowing Beverly is in a much better place now: "In life, in death, in life beyond death, God is with us. We are not alone. Thanks be to God."

Thankfulness is where Kay and I find ourselves even in grief, thanks for the good life Mom lived, for loving family, for the blessing of having someone so special in our lives, for laughter, for happy times, good memories and knowing that anything that fell short of this just wasn't all that important in the end: "Nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus." Love prevails.

The morning Beverly died, I awoke with the distinct feeling that she had passed. I told Kay about it and shortly after, her sister called to say Mom was gone. So I guess Beverly swung by our place on the way to meet Jesus. That would be like her. Now, we wish her well as she forever keeps, "Going and going and going ..."

It's really important this time of year that leaves die and fall to the ground to decay and nourish the soil for seasons to come. The release of the leaves allows a tree to shift it's resources to preparing for winter, a dormancy that readies it to produce new leaves, bloom and fruit in the spring and summer that follow. It's all good, part of the cycle of life, the divine plan.

What new opportunities and new life are just around the corner for us, for our church? May our trust in "the love of God in Christ Jesus" heal our grief and awaken our joy.






Eddy House Dinners Tuesdays, October 14 & 28


CALL TO THE FALL MEETING
