Lent is all about darkness. Its 40 days are reminiscent of the time Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by the devil. Not exactly happy times. Trying times. Soul-searching times. We began the season with the sign of the cross in ashes on our foreheads, reminding us of what we amount to without the breath of God, a reminder of the death of Jesus Christ who gave his life for our sake, a sacrifice for our sins. Darkness. And yet, this tragic truth also reveals what an amazing gift God's forgiveness in Christ truly is. Easter celebrates light overcoming darkness, victory over sin and death. Love wins.

With a war raging (by the time you read this, I sincerely hope it has subsided) which has pulled in nations around the world with military support for Ukraine and sanctions against Russia, a darkness has settled over the globe. As I write this, China and Russia are negotiating the possibility of an alliance, God forbid. There are renewed concerns of nuclear war, at a level we haven't seen since the Cold War. Some of us older folks may recall elementary school drills requiring us to hide under our desks in case of a nuclear attack. Those must have been sturdy desks! My father built a bomb shelter under our house in 1959. We may not yet have "boots on the ground" in Ukraine, but with arms flowing from all over, international banking sanctions, protests around the world, property seizures, intercontinental missile testing by numerous nations and a massive cyberwar underway, this is arguably already a world war. Its something none of us hoped we would ever see, but here it is.

There are a lot of ashes in times of war. We bear one another's grief and loss. We need the breath of God, the victory of Christ ... *Easter.*

The Scriptures make it clear that we are to love one another, even our enemies, but this doesn't mean standing by as evil is perpetrated on innocent people. Jesus knew when to turn the tables over and didn't hesitate to confront the corruption of his day. But in all instances, his words and actions were centered in the will of God. So too for us who seek to follow him in these challenging days. The darkness must be faced, evil confronted, but not by adding to it, not by settling scores and making things worse. We are, after all, people of the resurrection, people of Easter and bear our Savior's amazing grace and saving love to the world. We are meant to be, by God's love, Christ's salvation and the Holy Spirit's inspiration, stars that shine in the dark.

We share Christ's victory. We live in the shining truth of love that never ends. Our hope is sure. And this means we can expect a truly awesome Easter this year, the best one in long time, filled with the joy of the most blessed day of the year. The love of Christ meets us here and saves our souls and gives us every reason to be grateful and committed to living as God intends, being peacemakers, being blessed, being a blessing.

It's time for the stars to shine, for the Son to rise! He is risen! He is risen indeed!
