# "Let there be peace on earth"



"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders."

And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

- Isaiah 9:6

Bethlehem is located five miles south of Jerusalem. Its actual name today is, "Beit Lahm", an Arabic, not Jewish, form of the name. That's because it is located in the West Bank which is in the State of Palestine that also includes the Gaza strip along the Mediterranean coast. Palestine is considered "occupied territories" because Israel claimed the regions for itself after the 1967 Six-Day War. It's complicated. Two different religions and cultures have claimed the same "Holy Land" for centuries, believing they alone have divine and eternal rights of ownership through God's covenant with Abraham. This makes for terrible neighbors. Bethlehem, so much the focus of our Christmas season, is near the boundary and is fortified with tall graffiti-covered concrete walls and barbed wire.

### "O Little Town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie."

It bears remembering that Bethlehem didn't actually lie in stillness in the time when Jesus was born, either. It was occupied by the army of the Roman Empire and people suffered greatly under violent foreign rule. There are parallels. It was into a world of conflict that Jesus was born, "the Son was given".

The vision of the prophet Isaiah was for a day free of war, the arrival of God's Messiah who would be the Prince of Peace. The fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy in Jesus Christ is our reason for celebrating this season.

Of course, not all people believe in Christmas. The truth of God in Jesus is a precious gift, one we believe can bring the world the hope, peace, love and joy it has yearned for so long. It is the belief that there is a better way to live, the way of God's love for all people. This is the central truth and proclamation of Christmas. It is the bright star leading the way, the new birth.

This means you and I have an incredibly important message to share with the world this Christmas, a message of real peace on earth. As we sing: "Let it begin with me."

So send the Christmas cards, sing the carols, decorate the tree, hold a candle on Christmas Eve and proclaim the Good News that the Prince of Peace has come. Now as much as ever, it matters greatly that we do what we can to bear Christ's light and hope to the world.


# Christmas Eve, December 24th at 10a & 7p
