FROM THE PASTOR

"With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before God on high?
Shall I come before the Lord with burnt offerings, with calves a year old?
Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of oil?
Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?
God has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you, but to seek justice, love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?"

-Micah 6:6-8

This is the Old Testament passage we heard on Sunday, January 29. I'm always delighted when it appears in the Common Consensus Lectionary, the list of scripture readings we follow for weekly worship. I requested it be read at my ordination nearly 40 years ago and for my installation services at the churches I've served since (Except here: I arrived during the Covid shutdown so an installation never happened). My father read the passage for my ordination and until he passed away, for each of my installation services.

Unless someone changes the page, you'll find the Bible on our altar always open to Micah 6:6-8. I've returned to this passage over and over through the years because it is one of the clearest examples in the Bible of what our relationship with God is meant to be about. Micah 6:6-8 sums it up, says everything that needs to be said. Short and sweet, simple. Sometimes, things don't have to be overly complicated.

Jesus said,

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength."

He quoted this from Deuteronomy 6:4-5, and like many other rabbi's of the day, quite likely had a written copy of the passage on his person at all times. It summed everything up for him, so he shared it with his followers, that they might know the things that matter most.

In our recent Congregational Conversations, we've been discussing our purpose and mission, seeking to discern Christ's call for us individually and as a church. At our most recent meeting, we tweaked our "Vision Statement" a bit more and this was the result:

"We are called to be a community of love and hope in action."

Simple. Clear. This sums it up for us, describes our purpose, who we are as the Congregational Church in Killingworth, UCC. Hopefully, it will help others know who we are, too, and serve as a way for them to identify with and become involved in the ministry and mission to which we are all called in Christ.

AARP Tax-Aide Appointments

AARP trained volunteers will be available for **free and confidential tax preparation** at four sites in our area: Clinton Town Hall (Mondays), Killingworth Congregational Church (Tuesdays), Westbrook Library (Wednesdays), and at the

Estuary Senior Center in Old Saybrook (Fridays).

New This Year - Appointments for the AARP Tax-Aide program will be available for scheduling starting on Friday, January 20. There are two ways to make an appointment:

- 1) Online at https://www.aarp.org/money/taxes/aarp taxaide/locations.html and search for any of the local sites (Old Saybrook, Westbrook, Killingworth, or Clinton)

 OR
- 2) by calling 860-579-3192. (Please note that this is not the Estuary's phone number.) This number will be staffed on Mondays from 11am-2pm, Thursdays from 2-5pm, and Fridays from 9am-noon and from 2-5pm. The volunteer making the appointment will remind you of what to bring to your appointment (e.g., last year's return; all 2022 forms such as Social Security, W-2s, 1099-Rs, unemployment, bank and brokerage statements, and a voided check if you would like direct deposit or direct withdrawal.)

Note that Tax-Aide volunteers cannot prepare returns for taxpayers who changed their state of primary residence during 2022 or for taxpayers who run a business with inventory, depreciation, or a loss.

After you make an appointment and before that date, you need to pick up an envelope with the intake form, which is to be completed at home, prior to coming for your appointment. You can get your envelope at the site where your appointment is, **except in Killingworth**, the envelopes will be at the front desk of the **Killingworth Library**, not the Congregational Church.




Ranger Tristan Schemmerling to Honor Those Who Served
