Luke 15:16

We all need some rest and relaxation once in a while. Perhaps this summer will provide you the opportunity for a vacation or at least some down time from work and worry, a space for reflection, regrouping or just taking it easy. It's good for the body, mind and soul.

It's obvious as we read the Gospels that Jesus was in high demand. 
ments. It is a lovely way to bring that special someone to our church family's attention.
