FROM THE PASTOR

"And they will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not lift up the sword against nation, and never again will they learn war. "

Isaiah 2:4

They call Memorial Day the "unofficial" beginning of summer. It is, of course, much more than that. The traditional Memorial Day parade was held in Killingworth this past Monday, concluding with a program on the steps in front of the church. It's a short but wonderful annual tradition with people of all ages marching and waving flags, vets driving old military vehicles, community service organizations carrying banners and the high school band playing patriotic music. There were speeches and dedications. Local veterans who lost their lives in service to the country were remembered. The flag was raised and the pledge was recited. It was a mixture of good times and solemn purpose, just as life often is.

They say it's important to remember not only those who went to war, but the sacrifices, the personal losses, the human toll of war so that history won't repeat itself. This is said as we are actively supporting/engaged in a war abroad that looks more and more each day like the beginning of something bigger, something worse. Memory can be way too short.

The day before the Memorial Day parade was Pentecost Sunday, which we celebrated in true Pentecost fashion with prayers and preaching and hymns about the gift of Christ's Holy Spirit. It may have occurred to some of those attending that there wasn't any patriotic music that day. The reason is simple – Pentecost is one of the holiest days of the year, the day the Christian church was born, the day the Holy Spirit filled the hearts and souls of the believers who brought a message of hope and eternal love to all people. It would be unimaginable to sing a patriotic hymn on Christmas Eve or Easter Sunday. Pentecost is like that. So Sunday was filled with faith that knows no national boundaries and Monday was filled with national pride. We live in both worlds, but ultimately, our hearts belong to God. It is this core relationship that is meant to guide all others, whatever our national allegiance may be.

So in this time of remembering, how very important it is that we remember we are God's children and that it matters greatly how we treat each other, that even as we struggle to get along in an often violent world, we continue to bear the light of peace into dark places. We do this, "for God so loved the world", after all, and we are at our best when we do the same.

Which is to say, the best possible way to honor the war dead is to do our best to keep others from dying. The higher ideals for which many have died in service only have lasting meaning if we aspire to preserve them and by the grace of God, by the most peaceful, most life-affirming ways possible. Indeed, may the great and wonderful day come when at last our swords are beaten into plowshares.

So how very fitting it was that Memorial Day parade concluded at the steps of the church, don't you think?

Sunday, June 11




