FROM THE PASTOR

"Then Jesus told them many things in parables, saying: 'A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.'"

(Matthew 9:3-8)

Kay and I checked out the seed displays at some local stores the other day. There were hundreds of seed packets for flowers and herbs and veggies, their bright photos on the outside promising amazing results. For farmers and gardeners, this time of year is for dreaming about getting back in the soil for planting and growing and eventually harvesting. We bought a handful of packets and will start planting when conditions are right.

If you're familiar with farming and gardening you know it takes a certain amount of care to nurture a young plant to maturity and eventual harvest. One could just save the trouble and throw seeds on the ground and some might even sprout, but for more productive results it's really important to provide the right conditions for plants to grow at their best. There are challenges such as unpredictable weather, weeds, disease and insects, but by dealing with things as they come and learning along the way, a good harvest will likely result and there will be fresh and healthy food for the table.

Our church is something of a seedbed, a greenhouse and a fertile field where we learn the ways of God and seek to grow in wisdom and faith, seeking to become better people whose lives yield a harvest of goodness and grace. Faith isn't a thing we acquire in finished form, but grows and blooms and yields fruit throughout our lives. There can be setbacks and course corrections at times, but good gardeners learn through experience and apply what they learn.

In the past several months, we've given a lot of thought to what it means to be a church and the responsibilities we have to one another, how we can provide a safe and caring environment for both children and adults. We've responded to concerns with corrective actions, patience and prayer, making changes along the way as we seek the best way forward. The result is that we are becoming a stronger and safer, more faithful community. As we continue on this path, applying what we learn, we grow in spirit. Faith blooms, good things happen and there is a harvest of the goodness and grace God intends for us.

As the pandemic diminishes, as winter turns to spring, as Lent leads to Easter with the wonderful celebration of new life in Christ, we look forward with hope and great expectation for this new season and the good things that are sure to come.


