

FROM THE PASTOR



*And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out His love into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, whom He has given us."*

*Romans 5:5*

What a wonderful Easter Sunday we just had! It felt so good to be back in the church for the holiest day of the year with mask-optional worship so we could sing and celebrate and actually be heard. With lilies up front and Easter hymns being played on organ, piano and violin (!) and wind-up hoppy bunnies and chicks for the Children's Message, it was the perfect day. MANY THANKS to everyone who worked extra hard from Palm Sunday through Holy Week to Easter Day to make it all possible. It sure was nice to see the sanctuary nearly three times as full as on a typical Sunday.

Now, we enter into the season of Easter which lasts 7 weeks until Pentecost Sunday (June 5). During this time we'll hear the biblical stories about the beginning days of the Christian faith. Easter began a faith movement that continues to this day, one of never-ending hope and new life because of the resurrection of Jesus. I like to say we are "Easter people" because our faith is so centered in the event of Christ's rising from the tomb. Easter is, after all, the reason we worship on Sundays, a weekly remembrance of Resurrection Day. In the past three churches I served, we moved to a weekly celebration of Communion because of this. I don't know if this is something that would be meaningful for CCK, but certainly it is good to remind ourselves why we worship on Sundays and not forget that the gift of Christ's saving love is what brings us to together and sends us forth to serve.

Being "Easter people" also informs our response to the many challenges we face in the world today. With so much concerning news, it is easy to feel overwhelmed and discouraged. We know that depression and anxiety are on the rise for adults and children. Certainly, the troubles of our time are daunting and may even seem insurmountable, but we are not without the power to overcome because we are God's people and Christ's followers. Our faith is not just about feeling good, about "blessed assurance", but also about being equipped to address the issues of the day. We have the boundless and eternal love of God in Christ that death cannot contain, that endures all things and forever offers the hope of goodness and grace and reconciliation and peace. It calls us to confront evil and with love, undo it, diffuse it, defeat it and then in its place, plant, nurture, encourage, grow and celebrate new life. The challenges are great and the way isn't easy, but God is good all the time and love not only perseveres, but seeks new opportunity to emerge in new and wonderful ways.

This is why this Easter is so particularly wonderful. Sin and death do not stand a chance. Love wins. And the more you and I live out and share this truth, the better the world will be for everyone.





## Preservation 2020: Phase 2 Starts in Mid-May

Spring has arrived and with it comes warm weather, flowers....and Phase 2 of our church's restoration.

In January 2022, SHPO (the Connecticut State Historic Preservation Office) awarded the church a second grant - matching state funds totaling \$39,700 for Phase 2 restoration. Work is scheduled to begin in May and should be completed by late summer, 2022.

Phase 2 focuses on the sanctuary's exterior structure below the belfry – exterior carpentry, roof, painting, window repairs (sills and jambs), architectural moldings and trim, plus repairs on all of the center front door's hardware for functionality and safety. No work is required on the stone foundation.

Upon completion of Phase 2, the church will immediately apply to SHPO for a Phase 3, which centers on stabilization and restoration of the church's dome between the roof and the ceiling plus the interior surface painting and stenciling. Once approved, Phase 3 will start in fall, 2022, through early 2023.

Phase 4, in 2023, will include parking lots, the bell/clock/and carillon, and cushions and carpet in the sanctuary as funding allows.

### Estimated Timelines and Scope of Work

<u>Phase</u>	<u>Timeline</u>	<u>Scope of Work</u>
Phase 1	Completed, 2021	Repairs in the belfry: spindles, railings, finials and regilding the weathervane.
Phase 2	May-September, 2022	Roof, windows, exterior painting, center front doors.
Phase 3	Fall-Winter, 2022-23	Stabilization of dome, painting and plastering.
Phase 4	TBD, 2023	Parking lots, sanctuary carpets and cushions, bell/clock/and carillon.

While SHPO grants offset 50% of the historic building restoration costs, additional funds are always needed for the non-building expenses. Please consider making a contribution toward our sanctuary's restoration in its 202<sup>nd</sup> year. Donations can also be earmarked for specific areas including the church's exterior, interior and the bell/carillon.

Please contact Committee Chair Charlie Smith (203-430-5887) for information or donations. We are especially grateful to our congregation and our community – past and present -- for their continued support of our beautiful, historic landmark.
