

-From "The Starfish Story", by Loren Eisely

In a recent conversation with a member of the church, we wondered together what our response might be, what actions our church might take considering the many challenges we face today, both national and global. After all, the sheer magnitude of the issues of the day can feel impossibly overwhelming. How can we get our heads around the climate crisis, social and political strife, economic uncertainties and global conflicts? It's just too much!

I'm accustomed to being able to figure things out, find a way through a problem and usually come out at a better place, but I'm not so sure these days. There are times we pray our way forward, unsure of ourselves, but trusting in the One who knows more and knows better than we do. And we take one step at a time.

I am reminded of a story about saving starfishes. You may have heard me share it before, so please forgive the repetition, but this one is worth retelling. It's one of those illustrations we might all benefit from remembering. The author is Loren Eisely, an American anthropologist and writer who passed away in 1977. Here is my paraphrased version:

After a storm, a woman walking along a beach found thousands of starfish washed up on the sand, unable to return to the water. As she walked along, she would bend down and pick one up, then toss it into the waves. A man coming the other direction stopped and asked her why she bothered to do this, when there were far too many for it to make a difference. She looked at the starfish in her hand and said to him, "It matters to this one."

When Jesus healed people, he did it one person at a time. It was enough to change the world. Even when we are unsure of ourselves or the way forward, we can make a difference by the grace of God. Christ calls us to be the change, the means by which his saving love is manifest, his light of hope shines.

Join the conversation on October 16 after worship as we sit down together to consider Christ's call upon our lives and the ways of healing and hope he now sets before us.



## **PRESERVATION 2020 UPDATE**

Our Killingworth "skyline" is looking better and brighter! Work on Phase 2 of Preservation 2020 is wrapping up this autumn, and it's right on schedule.

Complete Phase 2 restorations included: Painting on all sides of the building below the steeple, including the front doors, pediments, molding, and trims; replacement of front door hardware; and repairs of windows, gutters and downspouts.

Pending a third grant from SHPO (State Historic Preservation Office), Phase 3 begins later this year and focuses on interior repair and restoration. Target areas include interior dome repair and painting, ceiling stain/plaster repair and stenciling.

Phase 3 is expected to be completed by Spring, 2023.

Once completed, we're more than halfway there. Future phases include parking lots and repairs on the bell, carillon and clock.

While SHPO grants offset many expenses, additional funds are always needed. Please consider making a contribution toward our sanctuary's restoration in its 202<sup>nd</sup> year. Donations can also be earmarked for specific areas including the church's exterior, interior and the bell/carillon.

Please contact Committee Chair Charlie Smith (203-430-5887) for information or donations. We are especially grateful to our congregation and our community – past and present -- for their continued support of our beautiful, historic landmark.
