From the Pastor

"And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

-The Apostle Paul (Philippians 4:7)

For several weeks, we've been following a series of New Testament readings in church from the Gospel of Luke: Luke 16:19-31; Luke 17:5-10; Luke 17:11-19; Luke 18:9-14. A common theme is evident among them – Christ's followers are to honor and respect all people, regardless of race, nationality or social perspective or status. The theme reflects Christ's revelation of, "the greatest of all commandments" (Mark 12:30-31) :

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength ... and your neighbor as yourself".

With a backdrop of increasing division, hatred and violence in our country, the Good News of Jesus we seek to learn, teach and preach here stands in stark contrast. The core values of our Christian faith are called into question. Evil is a reality we all face and these days, it is taking forms not seen before in any of our lifetimes.

I name no names or political parties because, frankly, there is plenty of blame to go around. The old axiom, "Absolute power corrupts absolutely" is as true today as it ever was and it applies to many who rise to power in business and government. The other reason I avoid finger-pointing is because Jesus expressly forbade it (consider the Luke 18:9-14 passage, for example). In Jesus day, there were innumerable horrific acts of violence perpetrated against innocent people by the legions of the Roman Empire, but Jesus made no mention of this. He didn't call out Caesar or any of the Roman authorities that made life miserable, even unbearable for many Jews and their neighbors. As God's Messiah, he certainly wasn't blind to these issues. He certainly felt the social, political and economic stress personally, but had an entirely different perspective on things, a focus so vital, so true, that everything else paled by comparison. At all times and in all places, Jesus focused on the kingdom of God. It was his core belief that the world would be a much better place if people turned their hearts to God, if they humbled themselves, letting go of pride and power to become available to the love of God, love that manifested itself in love of self and neighbor. This was the central truth. This was the key to healing, hope, wholeness and peace in God's world. Indeed, he gave his life to proclaiming this message, to reaching across the boundaries, to loving the whole people of God.

So I encourage you, even in all the current confusion and uncertainty, to put your trust in Jesus, put your trust in God, be the person the Savior calls you to be. It's big picture stuff. It's having a focus on the kingdom of God. It is the way to a better place.

Today is a good day to take a step in the right direction.





November 23rd is Pumpkin bread baking - we will also make hygiene kits for the Eddy shelter


November 30th- Advent Wreath workshop during Sunday school.






During worship, through prayer and the ringing of the bells, we will remember those who have died in the past year. Don't miss this beautiful worship service.


Eddy House Dinners
