They began studying oboe at age twelve before entering the Talent Development Program at age fifteen. Mekhi is a recent graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music and a current student at Jefferson University.

Mekhi has performed with numerous orchestras as principal, second oboe, or English horn. These include The Atlanta Symphony, Baltimore Symphony, Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, Memphis Symphony, Princeton Symphony, American Composers Orchestra, and Philadelphia Chamber Orchestra.
