If you would like your children to receive communion instruction prior to sharing in this Meal, please talk with the pastor before or after worship.

<u>Offering</u>: Offerings are not taken during worship. There is an offering plate at the back of the sanctuary and one near the front for you to drop an offering when you come up for communion. You may also scan the QR code on this page to give online.

Music Notes: As the Last Prelude, Chancel Choir presents a three-part (SAB) arrangement of the familiar hymn, "Trust and Obey," by Daniel B. Towner (1850-1919). The voicing ranges from women to men, and from unison to two and three parts, all over a supportive piano accompaniment. The arranger, Lisa Hoekstra, publishes her piano music and choral arrangements primarily online via <u>www.sheemusicplus.com</u>.

During the Psalm Time, Katy Koppa and Janie Robbins offer a duet: "You Say" as recorded by Lauren Daigle. It's the lead single from her third studio album, "Look Up Child" and was her third No. 1 on the Hot Christian Songs chart, where it spent 132 weeks at the top slot, breaking the record for most weeks at No. 1 for a song. It won the 2019 Grammy for Best Contemporary Christian Music Performance/Song and Top Christian Song at the 2019 Billboard Music Awards. She has said that she "knew this would be a song of my identity... I want this to be such a record of joy, such a record of hope, that people experience a childlikeness again."

The Hymn of the Day is taken from Augsburg's newest hymnal supplement: All Creation Sings, published in 2020. It is by David Lohman, who at age five, after seeing "Mary Poppins" and "The Sound of Music," "knew that [his] life was going to be about music." (<u>www.davidlohmanmusic.com</u>). David is the son of a Lutheran pastor, assistant conductor of the Twin Cities Gay Men's Chorus for two years and a Grammy nominee for his work as conductor of the Broadway touring show, "The Phantom of the Opera." He was Minister of Music for 16 years at Living Table United Church of Christ in Minneapolis. You can watch him conduct the hymn at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3wLQ63LMC-A&t=144s .

The piano music comprises piano arrangements of hymn tunes by the late Dale Wood, a renowned composer, organist and choral director best known for his church music compositions. At the age of 13, he won a national hymn-writing contest for the American Lutheran Church. He was the longtime organist and choirmaster at the Episcopal Church of St. Mary the Virgin in San Francisco, and served in a similar capacity in Lutheran churches in Hollywood and Riverside, California.
