



Music Notes:

As the **Last Prelude**, the Chancel offers a setting of a Cordelia Spitzer text by Lani ("Kamiki") Smith, a prolific and versatile composer and organist who published under many pen names, leaving behind more than 4,000 published works – making him one of the most prolific composers of classical music in history. Ms. Spitzer (1910-1999) was a composer and lyricist with hundreds of prize-winning poems to her credit and used widely by choirs, television and radio programs.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by James Quinn, SJ (1919-2010) was a Scottish Jesuit priest, theologian and hymnodist. The hymn was inspired by John 1:14: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." The tune, "Liebster Jesu, wir sind hier," was written by Johann R. Ahle (1625-1673), a musician and mayor, who was two organists before J.S. Bach at Mühlhausen.

The **Prelude and Postlude** comprise lovely carol setting embedded in a famous piece of classical music from the pen of Carolyne McGougan Taylor, who dedicated them to the memory of her very first piano teacher – her mother, Mrs. Una Helen McGougan. She is a graduate of the Florida State University School of Nursing. She pursued her interest in music during her husband's Bible college and seminary days. She currently lives in Winchester, Virginia, with her husband, Darrel Taylor, who pastors the Blue Ridge Grace Brethren Church. She is actively involved in piano instruction and serves as a church pianist and choir director for the adult and children's choirs.
