SECOND READING Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹ Now we know that, whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For no human will be justified before him by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin. ²¹ But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed and is attested by the Law and the Prophets, ²² the righteousness of God through the faith of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³ since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴ they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶ it was to demonstrate at the present time his own righteousness, so that he is righteous and he justifies the one who has the faith of Jesus. ²⁷ Then

what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. Through what kind of law? That of works? No, rather through the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

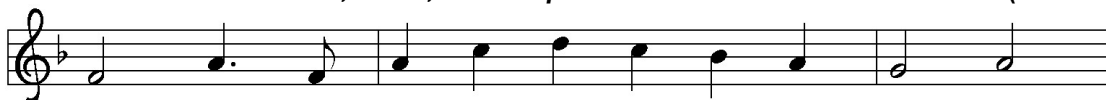

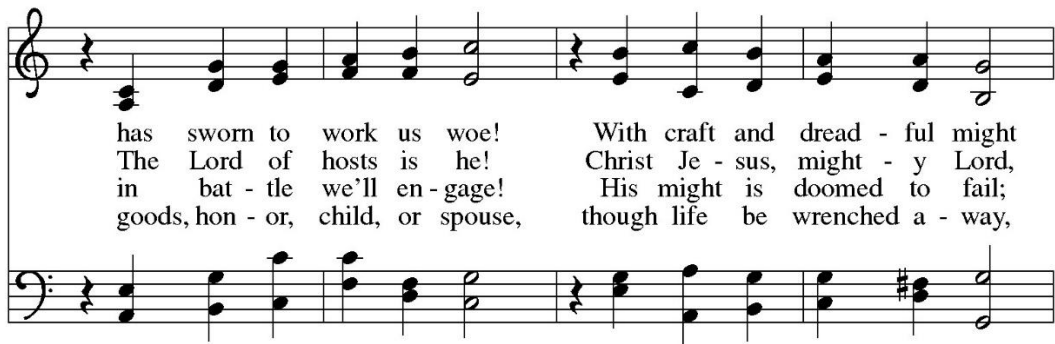

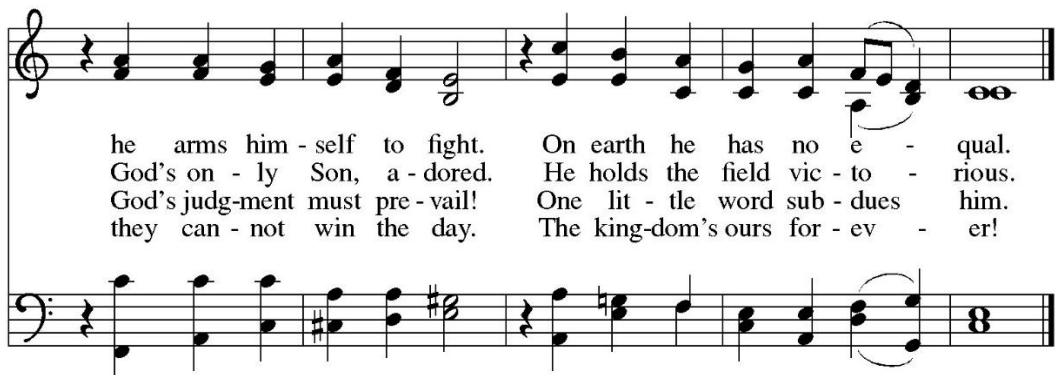

Music Notes:

The **Prelude** consists of arrangements by Lloyd Larson of familiar seasonal; hymns. Larson holds a BA from Anderson University (1976) and a MCM from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (1979) and has more than 1,500 published compositions and arrangements. As the **Last Prelude**, the Chancel Choir presents J.S. Bach’s magnificent arrangement of “Nun danket alle Gott” in an English translation by Catherine Winkworth (1829-1878). Trumpet and piano team up for the independent accompaniment. The **Postlude** is the Solemn Entry for the Knights of St. John (“Feierlicher Einzug” AV 103 / TrV 224) by Richard Strauss. Strauss was an eminent German composer, conductor, pianist and violinist, whose style would be described as late Romantic and early modern, using advanced (but not outlandish) harmonies. He was most successful in the areas of opera (e.g., “Der Rosenkavalier”) and tone poems (e.g., “Also sprach Zarathustra,” which was used by director Stanley Kubrick as the theme from “2001: A Space Odyssey”).

The **Hymn of the Day** is by Milwaukee-born Ronald A. Klug (1939-2021). Educated at Dr. Martin Luther College in New Ulm, MN, he was a schoolteacher (including in Madagascar) before becoming a free-lance writer. The tune, “Wojtkiewicz,” was written for this tune by Dale Wood (1934-2003). Wood produced more than 300 compositions, beginning with a prize-winning hymn tune at the age of 13.
