





⁸ The word of the LORD came to [Elijah,] saying, ⁹ “Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you.” ¹⁰ So he set out and went to Zarephath. Music Notes:

The Men's Chorus offers the **Last Prelude**. It is a close-harmony TTBB setting Horatius Bonar's text, "I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say" to the tune, "Third Mode Melody" by G. Winston Cassler. The arranger, G. (Glen) Winston Cassler studied at Oberlin Conservatory and with Sir Ernest Bullock (1890-1979) in England. He was a professor at St. Olaf's College in Northfield, MN.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Frances R. Havergal (1836-1879), who – despite ill health – began to write poetry at the age of 7 and learned six foreign languages. For her precocious nature, her father (the hymnologist William H. Havergal, 1793-1870) nicknamed her "Little Quicksilver". The tune, "Toma mi Voluntad," was written by William Pharris for a Spanish text he heard in El Salvador in the 1990's. His classmate at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, Mark Sedio, heard it and transcribed it.

Today's **Organ Music** comes from the Baroque period in editions by Wayne L. Wold (b. 1954), currently Director of Music Ministry at First Lutheran Church in Ellicott City, MD and Adjunct Associate Professor of Music at Shenandoah Conservatory of Shenandoah University in Winchester, VA. Giuseppe Torelli was an Italian violist, violinist, composer and teacher, who is remembered today for contributing to the development of the instrumental concerto and for being the most prolific Baroque composer for trumpets. Georg Philip Telemann was a multi-instrumentalist and one of the most prolific composers in history. He was almost completely self-taught in music, rejecting his family's choice of law. He knew both Bach and Handel personally. He was the godfather of Bach's son Carl Philipp Emanuel (1714-1788). Domenico Scarlatti, son of Alessandro Scarlatti (also a composer), composed in a variety of forms, but is best known today for his 555 keyboard sonatas. Johann Anton Kobrich was organist of Mariae Himmelfahrt in Landsberg, Germany where he served for 60 years.
