If you would like your children to receive communion instruction prior to sharing in this Meal, please talk with the pastor before or after worship.

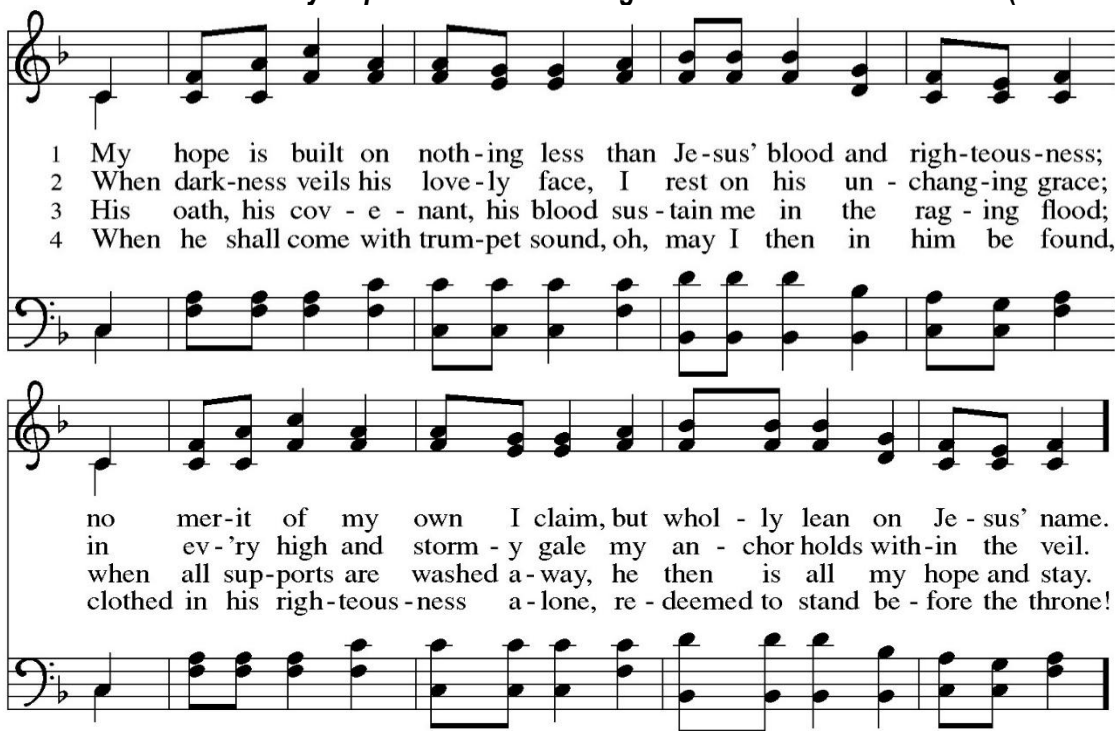

Music Notes:

The **Prelude** is by Philip David Wickham (b. 1984) is a Contemporary Christian musician, singer and songwriter from San Diego, California. Wickham has released nine albums; the song we hear being taken from 2016 album, “Children of God.”

The **Last Prelude** is an “ear worm” that will be going through your head “relentlessly” for the rest of the day: “Your love is relentless.” This song is from Hillsong Church, which was founded in 1983 by Brian and Bobbie Houston in the western suburbs of Sydney, Australia and now has churches in 23 countries and an average global attendance of 130,000 weekly. Hillsong is closely associated with the Australian Christian Churches.

During **Distribution**, we hear a new song for the Band this year by Matt Redman and Beth Redman that includes a traditional hymn (“It Is Well With My Soul”). Matt Redman, who in addition to being a singer-songwriter, is a published author with multiple books on Christian worship, including The Unquenchable Worshipper and the book Facedown (which accompanied the album of the same name). His latest book, Mirror Ball, relays his thoughts and experiences of “living boldly and shining brightly for the glory of God.” Beth, Matt’s wife, leads Vine, a discipleship ministry for women. She is an author, speaker, and Dove Award winning songwriter. Matt and Beth have five children and reside in California.

The **Postlude** is a catchy song by Zach Williams. It’s from Zach’s album, “Chain Breaker.” Born in Jonesboro, Arkansas, Williams took a detour from his “storybook childhood” through the “illusion of rock stardom,” and the drug and alcohol excesses that can so often accompany that lifestyle. Now a husband and father, he is an established Contemporary Christian artist with three Grammy Awards.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Edward Mote (1797-1874) in 1834. Neglected as a child, he became a successful cabinet maker and ultimately pastor of the Baptist Church in Horsham, Sussex, England. The tune, “The Solid Rock,” was written by William Bradbury (1816-1868) for this hymn in 1863. Bradbury was an American organist, singing teacher, piano retailer and music publisher.
