FIRST READING Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-7

¹⁵ The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶ And the LORD God commanded the man, “You may freely eat of every tree of the garden, ¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.” ^{3:1} Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. ¹² Just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, and so death spread to all because all have sinned ¹³ for sin was indeed in the world before the law, but sin is not reckoned when there is no law. ¹⁴ Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those who did not sin in the likeness of Adam, who is a pattern of the one who was to come. ¹⁵ But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died through the one man's trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many. ¹⁶ And the gift is not like the effect of the one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the gift following many trespasses brings justification. ¹⁷ If, because of the one man's trespass, death reigned through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ Therefore just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. ¹⁹ For just as through the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so through the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.



Music Notes:

As the **Last Prelude**, the Chancel Choir presents an anthem by Larry Shackley based on a text by Hugh Stowell (1799-1865), a Church of England clergyman with a reputation as a “vigorous and inspiring preacher”. The composer is a full-time composer and editor from Columbia, SC and has been active in church music since he was a teenager.

The **Prelude** and **Postlude** are by Paul Kickstat, based on Lenten chorale tunes. Kickstat was a German organist and music teacher. He was a conservatory theory and church music teacher and was cantor at the Klopstockkirche in Hamburg-Ottensen for 20 years. These pieces are mostly in three parts, with the melody often in the pedal. The pedal is not always the lowest sounding part – it depends on what stops are drawn. If a 4’ stop is drawn (as we hear in this morning’s preludes), the pedal melody will sound higher than the manuals.

The **Hymn of the Day** is an alternate translation to the more commonly used composite translation we usually sing. It’s by Frederic H. Hedge (1825-1890), a Unitarian minister based in New England who taught both German literature and church history at Harvard. The hymn has probably been written about, sung and translated as much or more than any other hymn in the church’s history.
