If you would like your children to receive communion instruction prior to sharing in this Meal, please talk with the pastor before or after worship.

<u>Offering</u>: Offerings are not taken during worship. There is an offering plate at the back of the sanctuary and one near the front for you to drop an offering when you come up for communion. You may also scan the QR code on this page to give online.


#### **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

## **GOSPEL READING Matthew 25:31-46**


P: The holy gospel, according to Matthew, the 25<sup>th</sup> chapter.

**C:** Glory to You, O Lord. (The gospel is announced)

<sup>31</sup>When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. <sup>32</sup>All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, 33 and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. 34Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; <sup>35</sup> for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, <sup>36</sup>I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' <sup>37</sup>Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup>And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup>And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' <sup>40</sup>And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' 41Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels: 42 for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, <sup>43</sup>I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit

me.' <sup>44</sup>Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' <sup>45</sup>Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' <sup>46</sup>And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."







#### **MUSIC NOTES:**

As the Last Prelude, the Chancel Choir presents a medley of "He Leadeth Me" with words by Joseph H. Gilmore (1834-1918) and music by William B. Bradbury (1816-1968) and "God Leads Us Along" by G. A. Young. The flowing accompaniment provides a gentle backdrop to the voices, which vary in texture from women to men to four parts.

The Hymn of the Day is by Delores Dufner, OSB, who wrote this hymn in 1986. The tune is the familiar "Greensleeves" melody, which dates back to at least 16th century England. Dufner, born in North Dakota in 1939, attended a one-room country school before becoming a Benedictine sister. She was a member of the executive committee of the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada.

The organ music is by Paul Kickstat, based on Lenten chorale tunes. Kickstat was a German organist and music teacher. He was a conservatory theory and church music teacher and was cantor at the Klopstockkirche in Hamburg-Ottensen for 20 years. These pieces are mostly in three parts, with the melody often in the pedal. The pedal is not always the lowest sounding part – it depends on what stops are drawn. If a 4' stop is drawn (as we hear in this morning's preludes), the pedal melody will sounder higher than the manuals.

Next week: Chancel Choir warms up at 8:15am, sings for 9:00am worship, and rehearses after worship at 10:15am. Bell Choir rehearses at 11:00am. All singers are welcome at 2:00pm for rehearsal for special Good Friday music.

# Important News from the Sabbatical Committee: Concerns during sabbatical

One concern has been what will happen if I or a family member has an emergency during the sabbatical. Pam Johnson, sabbatical committee member, is working on scheduling pastors who will handle emergencies for members of Grace. We plan to follow the existing pattern used by cluster pastors who fill in for emergencies. Exact details will be published before the sabbatical begins. If there is a death of a member of Grace or family member, the family has two options. The funeral/memorial service can be officiated by the pastor covering emergencies or the service can be scheduled with Pastor Bill when he returns.

The other concern has been communicating with Pastor Bill. Part of the gift of love of the sabbatical is not contacting Pastor Bill. Pastor Bill has also committed to avoid any communication about church issues. That does NOT mean that you cannot speak to him if you see him out in the public grocery store, restaurant, etc. The conversations at this time may not be about church or personal pastoral care issues.
