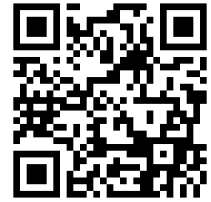

If you would like your children to receive communion instruction prior to sharing in this Meal, please talk with the pastor before or after worship.

**Offering:** Offerings are not taken during worship. There is an offering plate at the back of the sanctuary and one near the front for you to drop an offering when you come up for communion. You may also scan the QR code on this page to give online.

## Music Notes:

Today’s instrumental music comes from the Bell Choir The **Prelude** comprises two seasonal hymn arrangements. The first is a medley of “Crown Him” hymns by Michael Helman (b. 1956), currently Director of Music and Organist at Faith Presbyterian Church in Cape Coral, Florida. In addition to his numerous awards over 125 pieces of handbell, choral and organ music in print, he is an in-demand handbell festival director and clinician, as well as Handbell Editor for the Lorenz Corporation. The second is by Dan Edwards, Minister of Worship at Centerville Baptist Church in Chesapeake, VA. He holds a B. M. Ed. and a M. A. Ed. from James Madison University in Harrisonburg, VA and has published over 300 pieces for choir, handbells and small instrumental ensembles. He was selected as 2004 Composer of the Year by Jeffers Handbell suppl. As the **Last Prelude**, we hear a seasonal tune arranged by John A. Behnke, Emeritus Professor of Music at Mequon’s Concordia University, where he taught organ and handbells, and directed the Alleluia Ringers, Concordia’s touring handbell choir for 29 years. He received his M. Mus. and D. Mus. from Northwestern University and studied for a year at the Westphalian Church Music Institute in Hereford, Germany. The **Postlude** is an arrangement of Fanny J. Crosby’s (1820-1915) famous hymn, “To God Be the Glory” (tune by William H. Doane, 1832-1915). The arranger, R. Lyndel Littleton is Worship Pastor at Hilldale Baptist Church in Clarksville, TN. He was a double major in music at the University of Tulsa, OK (vocal and instrumental).

The **Hymn of the Day** is a poem by George Herbert (1593-1633) from his collection, *The Temple* (1633). Born in Wales and educated at Cambridge University, he was the Public Orator of Cambridge University and was later ordained an Anglican priest. The tune, "The Call," is by Ralph Vaughn Williams (1872-1958) and was used as the fourth of his *Five Mystical Songs* (1911). Next week: Mother's Day. Chancel Choir warms up at 8:15am, sings for worship at 9:00am, and rehearses (for the last time this 2025-26 Program Year) after worship at 10:15am.
