Music Notes:

This week’s special music comprises two selections from the Women’s Choir’s repertoire from the 2025-26 Program Year. As the **Last Prelude**, we hear a reprise of last week’s Gospel song by Ira David Sankey, long associated with preacher Dwight L. Moody (1837-1899) and his religious revival campaigns in the U.S. and Britain at the close of the 19th Century. In addition to writing tunes himself, he was a compiler and editor of popular hymn tune collections. **After the Psalm**, the group presents an anthem by Natalie Sleeth (née Wakely). Sleeth was born in Evanston, IL who began studying piano at the age of four. She earned a BA in music theory at Wellesley College in Massachusetts where she met and married the Rev. Dr. Ronald E. Sleeth, a professor of Homiletics. She holds two honorary doctorates (West Virginia Wesleyan University in 1989 and Nebraska Wesleyan University a year later). She was an organist and prolific composer who wrote more than 180 highly successful compositions for church and school. This one shows her skill with the technique of canon (a round).

The **Prelude** and **Postlude** comprise piano music by Marianne Kim (b. 1972), a Chicago-based pianist, organist, harpsichordist and composer. Her compositions range over wide swath of styles, from classical to jazz to R&B and gospel. After studying piano and composition in her native Korea at Pusan High School of the Arts, she earned a BM in composition at Pusan National University. After working as a professional musician for more than a decade in the United States, she earned dual Master of Music degrees in jazz studies and organ performance at Northern Illinois University.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Jeffery Rowthorn (1934-2025) in response to a request from the Yale Divinity School graduating class of 1978. Rowthorn was born in Wales, served in the Royal Navy, and was educated at Oxford and Union Theological Seminary. The tune, “Abbot’s Leigh,” was in Rowthorn’s mind when he wrote the text. It is named for a village near his birthplace.
