

SERMON



NICENE CREED







Music Notes:

Special music today comes from the Women's Choir, singing two selections from their repertoire of the past year. The **Last Prelude** is an arrangement of the familiar melody from Beethoven's Ninth Symphony by Peter C. Lutkin, an American organist, choral conductor, composer and professor and dean at Northwestern University. As a composer, he specialized in writing unaccompanied choral music, primarily for his own choirs. **After the Psalm** the group presents a combination of two original tunes for Pierpoint's famous text, "For the Beauty of the Earth". For the first two verses, the ladies present the first tune in unison, then the second is sung by the sopranos, and finally, the two tunes are combined for verse 4. The arranger, Hal Hopson (b.1933) is a full-time composer and church musician residing in Cedar Park, Texas with over 3,000 published works. His cantata, "God with Us," was one of the few compositions selected to be placed in a time capsule during the American Bicentennial in 1979 to be opened and heard again in 2076.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Samuel Longfellow (1819-1892), brother and biographer of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow (1807-1882), who was one of his teachers at Harvard. He earned his divinity degree at Harvard in 1846, then served as a Unitarian minister. He was a pacifist and abolitionist and supporter of women's rights. The tune, "Song 13," was by Orlando Gibbons (1583-1625), organist at the Chapel Royal and at Westminster Abbey. He was one of the best organists and composers of his time.

The **Organ** music is by John Behnke, Emeritus Professor of Music at Concordia University in Mequon, where he taught organ and handbells, and directed the Alleluia Ringers, Concordia's touring handbell choir for 29 years. He received his M. Mus. and D. Mus. from Northwestern University and studied for a year at the Westphalian Church Music Institute in Hereford, Germany.
