

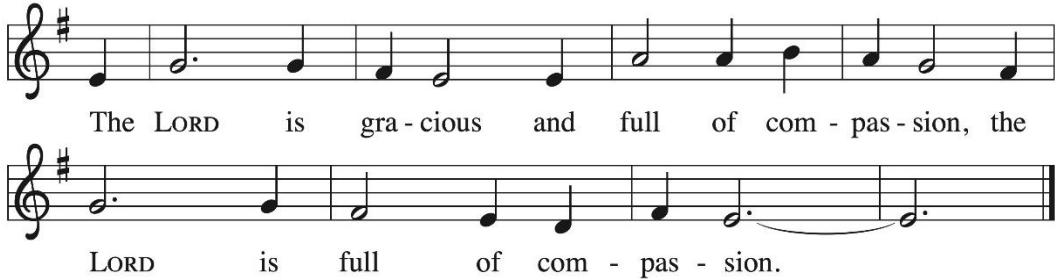

## Music Notes:

The **Prelude** is Charles Ives' famous "Variations on 'America'". This remarkable organ composition was written when Ives was only 17 for a Fourth of July celebration in 1892 at the Methodist church in Brewster, NY where he was organist. He described it as "almost as much fun as playing baseball." This marks Ives' first notated use of two different keys (F major and D-flat major in the first Interlude, and A-flat major and F major in the second) played at the same time. Ives was an "American original," one of the first American composers of international renown. He also achieved considerable fame in the insurance industry of his time as an executive and actuary, laying the foundations for modern estate planning.

As the **Last Prelude**, we hear a rousing take on the famous "Old Hundredth" psalm tune ("All People That on Earth Do Dwell") by Hiram Clarence Eddy. Eddy was an American organist and composer, serving churches in Chicago and was director of the Hershey School of Musical Art for more than thirty years. Among his notable accomplishments was a series of 100 organ recitals between 1877 and 1879, each of which had an entirely different program.

The **Postlude** is a "Grand March" by Samuel Whitney, another American organist, conductor and composer of church and chamber music. He came to be regarded as the greatest interpreter of Johann Sebastian Bach in the United States. He was professor of organ playing and lecturer in music at the Boston University and the New England Conservatory.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by C. Austin Miles (1868-1946), an American pharmacist who abandoned his career in 1892 to write gospel songs. He eventually became editor and manager of the Hall-Mack Publishing Company, which initially published his songs.
