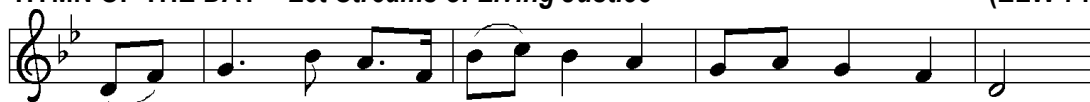

Music Notes:

As the **Last Prelude**, the Chancel Choir presents an anthem by Susan Naylor Callaway based on the tune "Showalter" by Anthony J. Showalter (1858-1924) with words adapted by Elisha A. Hoffman (1839-1929). The melody is reminiscent of the familiar Gospel tune but doesn't follow it exactly. Ms. Callaway received her B.A. (1977) and M.A. (1979) degrees in Music Education from Samford University in Birmingham, AL. Her music is in the catalogs of nine different publishers.

The **Hymn of the Day** is by William Whitla (b. 1934), who wrote it in 1989 in the wake of the events in Tiananmen Square. At the same time, the mothers of the Disappeared in Argentina were bringing their campaign, and religious and racial disputes were happening worldwide. Whitla is Canadian Anglican priest who was Professor of English and Humanities at York University, Toronto. The tune is the familiar "Thaxted," the theme for "Jupiter" in Gustav Holst's (1874-1934) *The Planets* (1921)

The **Prelude** and **Postlude** organ music is by John Behnke, Emeritus Professor of Music at Mequon's Concordia University, where he taught organ and handbells, and directed the Alleluia Ringers, Concordia's touring handbell choir for 29 years. He received his M. Mus. and D. Mus. from Northwestern University and studied for a year at the Westphalian Church Music Institute in Hereford, Germany.
