A Message from the Pastor and Notes

A Message from the Pastor

What is the human, that you are mindful of them? - Psalm 8:4

Some of you may not know this, but I hold a brown belt in Tae Kwon Do. TKD is a Korean form of marital arts using the hands and the feet for defense and protection. Don't get too excited, this was a long time ago and I'd be hard pressed to remember much of what I learned at that time in my life. But, I do remember enjoying it and I still remember a few things.

Because this martial art deals with self defense we learned a lot of techniques designed to protect oneself. One of those techniques created a very bad habit for me. We were often taught to be aware of your surroundings. The comings and goings of individuals and the happenings about you. If you ever watch Secret Service protect our President you will see them wearing sunglasses. This allows them to look around without being distracting to others.

However, I do not wear sunglasses, and this has created a habit for me that can often get in the way of my ministry. I am always checking out what else is going on around me. Not necessarily what is happening right in front of me in that moment. This has created a lack of mindfulness in my life.

But, I am not alone in this lack of mindfulness. Have you ever been sitting with someone and they pull out their phone to write a text message to someone else? Have you ever been cut off in traffic because someone was not paying attention to the road? Have you ever been halfway through a conversation only to forget what you were talking about because your head is filled with so many other thoughts and ideas? Then you have experienced the opposite of mindfulness.

Mindfulness in its most simple definition is being aware of the present moment. I have noticed that my ability to be mindful of my present moment has slipped in my life and ministry over the years. In ministry as in all our lives, mindfulness is an important part of our ability to focus and care for the person or event in our most immediate orbit.

I started learning about mindfulness just over a year or so ago. And since then I have learned to take precautions to protect my present moment so I can be most effective in communication and focus. This does not mean I do not think about the future or plan for it. But, I am learning to be more mindful of the person I am ministering to at that moment.

The passage above has a great Hebrew word that translates as "mindful." It is the Hebrew word "zakar" and it means "to be mindful", "to bring back to remembrance", and "to take thought." Remember reading the story of Noah in Genesis and seeing the passage that said, "And God remembered Noah"? That is the word "zakar". God never forgot Noah. God simply brought their own recognition back to Noah and his journey in the ark. What is the human that you should bring your remembrance back to them? What is the human that you should take thought of them?" Great question!

While on my sabbatical I will be learning how to be more mindful in my own life and faith, so I can be more mindful in my ministry as well. Perhaps I will learn how to use the phone again as a TOOL for ministry and not an appendage to be given more attention than the soul in my presence. This time to learn about mindfulness will be a blessing to us as it will provide us the focus we crave in this scattered world.

From the President

Hello members of Grace! I wanted to fill you in on <u>some</u> of the work the Grace Council has been busy with the last couple of months.

The church council voted on and approved two new measures that will help guide all teams at Grace. The first decision was to replace the word "committee" or "board" with the word "team" as a general term for all the various bodies that help serve Grace Lutheran and its members. It was rather confusing that some of those groups were called "boards" or "committees" or "teams" and we felt it would add clarity to have them all labeled as teams.

The second measure that was approved will be a continuing resolution (C.4.04.A23) in our current constitution particularly focusing on Chapter 13. We voted to adopt <u>Guiding Principles for Grace Teams</u>. You may be asking yourself "what are guiding principles and why are they necessary?" Guiding principles are any principles or precepts that guide an organization throughout its life in all circumstances, irrespective of changes in its goals, strategies, type of work, or management. They are necessary for a few reasons:

- They ensure cohesive goals around Grace's mission statement
- 2. They add clarity around the team's purpose
- 3. They help to prioritize the important values the church embodies
- 4. They maintain the legacy and documentation of the committees for future prosperity.

I won't list all the guiding principles here but will mention a couple of the key principles (The full set of guiding principles will be shared with all teams in the coming weeks):

- Teams will be inclusive, accepting, and respectful, and ensure safety while maintaining confidentiality when needed.
- 2. Each team must have a mission statement that supports Grace's Mission statement.


I hope that by adding these new measures, teams and members of Grace will feel empowered and guided by the council to step up as leaders of the congregation at Grace.


