While not a church festival, in our culture we have often seen this day as a time to focus our attention on spring. Will it be an early spring? Or will we have six more weeks of winter? Your guess is as good as the groundhog's.

The "Festival" of Groundhog Day does remind us that the long dreary days of winter WILL come to an end. After the winter we have had so far, I am sure I can already hear the "AMEN" rising from your heart as I type these words. Scripture reminds us time and time again that whatever adversity we are going through, it will come to an end. One of my favorite scriptures in the King James Version is when it says, "And it came to pass..." Whatever we are going through did not come to stay...it will indeed pass.

The festival we have this month is Ash Wednesday (February 18). Ash Wednesday is the season of repentance and self-examination. It is a time for us to focus on our lives of faith and where we may need to repent of things that hold us back from experiencing God's grace to the fullest extent. Ash Wednesday of course, is the beginning of the Lenten season.

The goal of Ash Wednesday is Easter. Easter is the season of resurrection and new birth. More on that as the weeks progress. Just as Groundhog Day is a reminder that this long dreary winter will come to an end, Ash Wednesday also reminds us of a time of repentance that will culminate with the resurrection. Both seasons are times for us to rest, reflect, and restore our bodies (winter) and our faith (Lent).

While we look forward to spring and Easter with eager anticipation, let us not forget to relax into the season of refreshment we see in these final winter months and in the season of repentance. For both of these will prepare us to gratefully receive the Alleluia of spring and the continued promise of the resurrection.

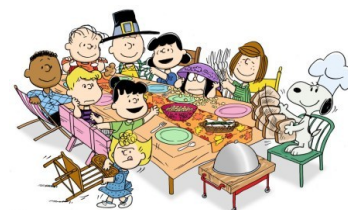
Guest House Sandwiches

Lenten Book Discussion

In our world today (as is the history of humanity), people have taken the scriptures and used them to harm, dominate, and oppress others. Zach Lambert has written a great book entitled, ***Better Ways to Read the Bible: Transforming a Weapon of Harm Into a Tool of Healing***. This Lent we will be offering a discussion on this book and its material. If you wish to purchase the book, you are welcome to, but the book will not be needed for the study. This study will meet on Wednesday mornings at 10:30am (2/25, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, and 3/25) and Thursday evenings at 6:45pm (2/26, 3/5, 3/12, 3/19, and 3/26). There will be lots to talk about and learn as we grow to use the scriptures for good.

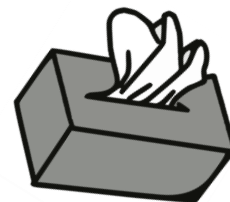
Chili Cook-off/Pie Auction
