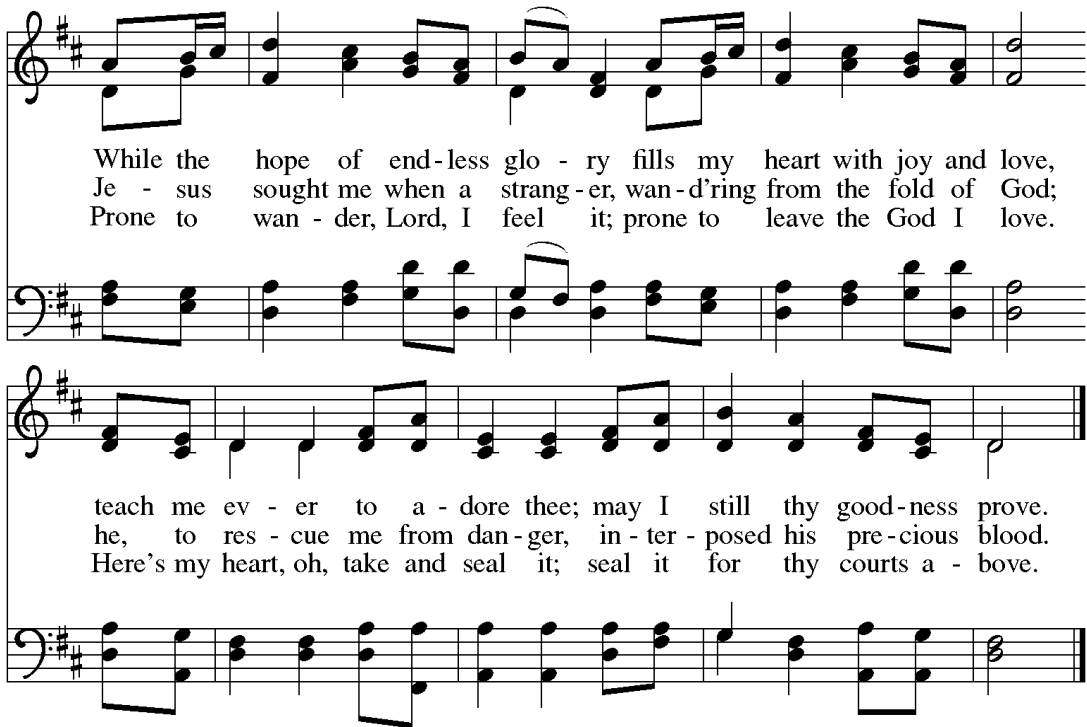

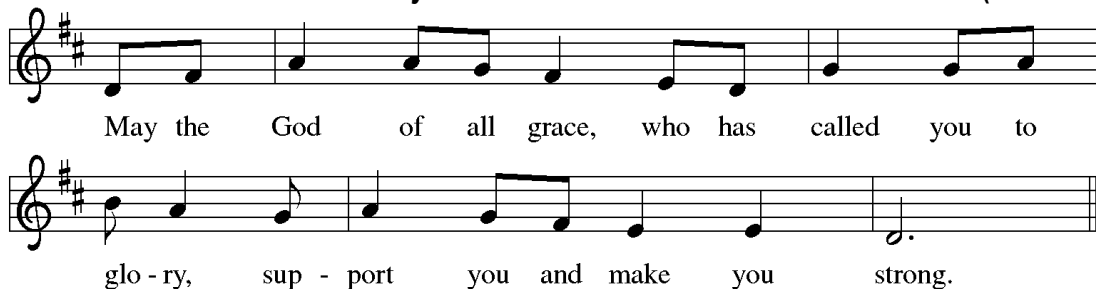

Music Notes:

Today's instrumental music is supplied by the Bell Choir. The **Prelude** comprises two hymn arrangements on familiar tunes by Cathy Moglebust. Ms. Moglebust has developed and directed handbell music programs since 1983, with more than 400 compositions and arrangements in print. Her music has been broadcast on the "Today" and "Good Morning, America" television programs. She holds her BA and M. Ed degrees from South Dakota State University. The **Last Prelude** is an arrangement of Mozart's famous motet, "Ave Verum Corpus." Mozart wrote this in 1791 for the Feast of Corpus Christi for the choir at St. Stephan in Baden bei Wien, directed by his friend Anton Stoll. It is a late work, composed less than six months before Mozart's death. (As Mr. Dearing often says, "there's a reason you can't graduate from music school without learning this piece.") The arranger, Fred Merrett (1924-2023) was the son of parents active in the Salvation Army who became Bandmaster of the Salvation Army Winnipeg Citadel Senior Band for 27 years. He introduced handbells into the curriculum at Winnipeg Technical Vocational High School and published nearly 150 compositions for handbells. The **Postlude** is an original composition by young composer Matthew Compton. Mr. Compton is Music Director of the Bells of the Cascades in Vancouver, WA and has been composing, arranging and conducting music for handbells since he was in 8th grade, publishing his first piece at age 15.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Johann Heerman (1585-1647) between 1623 and 1630, during the Thirty Years' War, during which he almost lost everything he owned and was nearly killed. This hymn has been referred to as his "Master Song". He was a fine hymn writer, second only to Paul Gerhardt (1607-1676) during his lifetime. The tune, "Was frag ich nach der Welt," is part of a group of 17th Century tunes with interchangeable names and melodic parts. It might have been written by Ahasuerus Fritsch (1629-1701) – who also lived during the Thirty Years' War – or might be anonymous.
