If you would like your children to receive communion instruction prior to sharing in this Meal, please talk with the pastor before or after worship.

Offering: Offerings are not taken during worship. There is an offering plate at the back of the sanctuary and one near the front for you to drop an offering when you come up for communion. You may also scan the QR code on this page to give online.

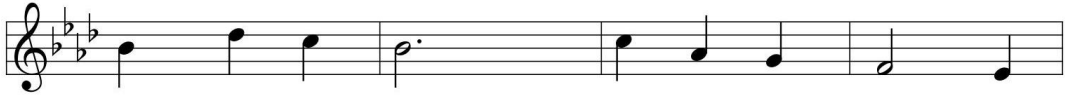

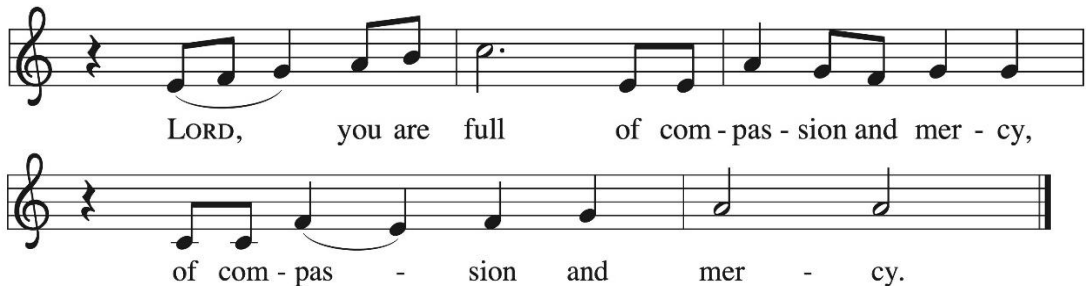

FIRST READING Genesis 50:15-21

¹⁵ Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, "What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?" ¹⁶ So they approached Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this instruction before he died, ¹⁷ 'Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you.' Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸ Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, "We are here as your slaves." ¹⁹ But Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid! 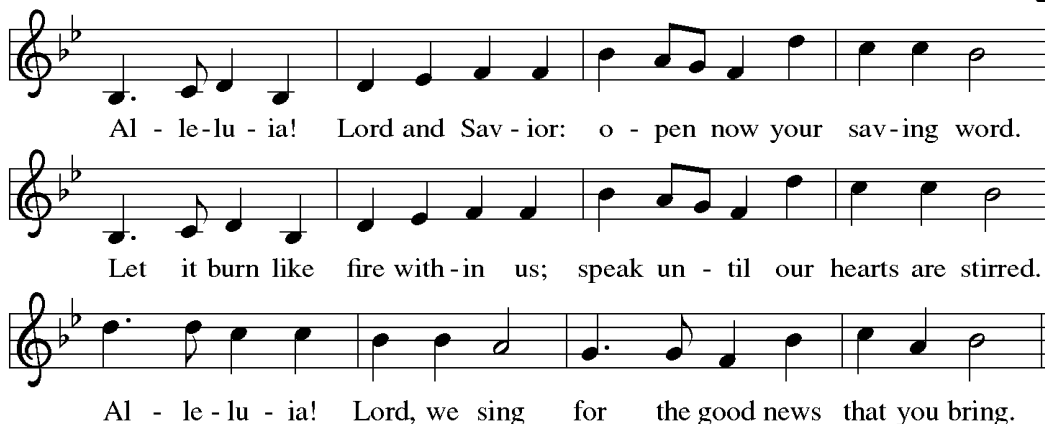

As many as seven times?" ²² Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times. ²³ "For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. ²⁴ When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him, ²⁵ and, as he could not pay, the lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions and payment to be made. ²⁶ So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' ²⁷ And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. ²⁸ But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him by the throat he said, 'Pay what you owe.' ²⁹ Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' ³⁰ But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. ³¹ When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. ³² Then his lord

summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³ Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' ³⁴ And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. ³⁵ So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

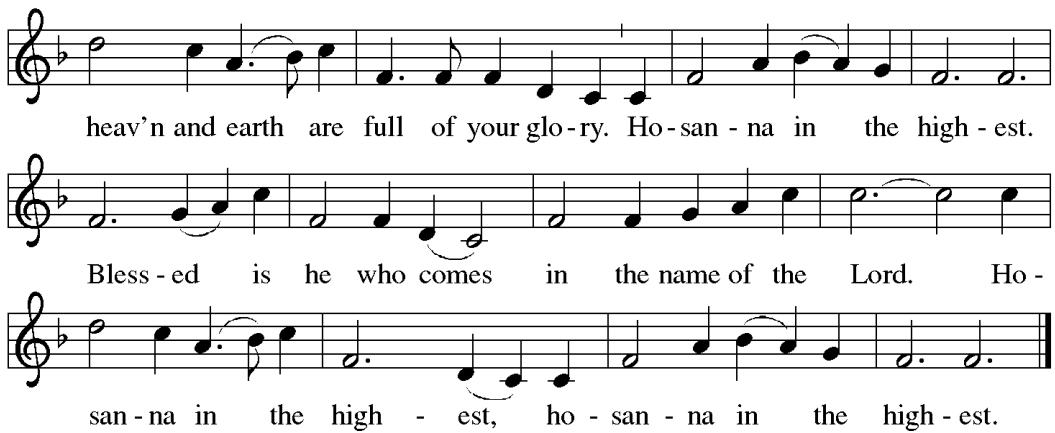

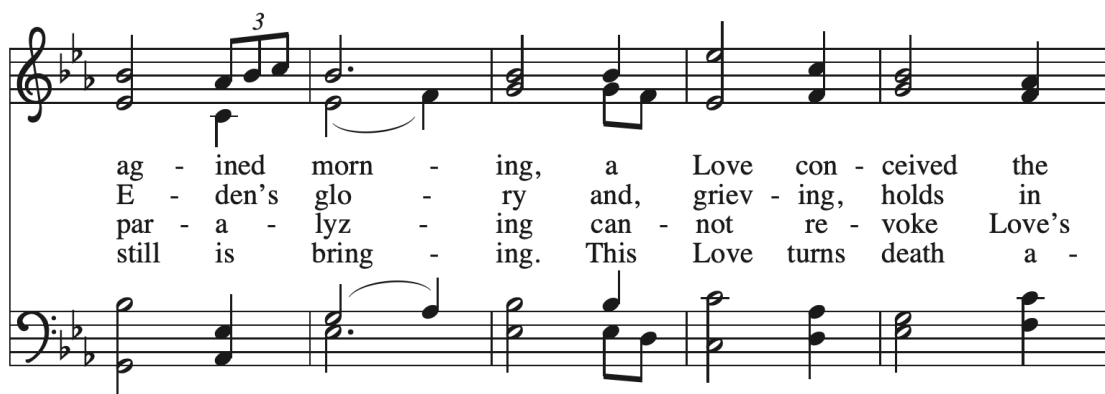

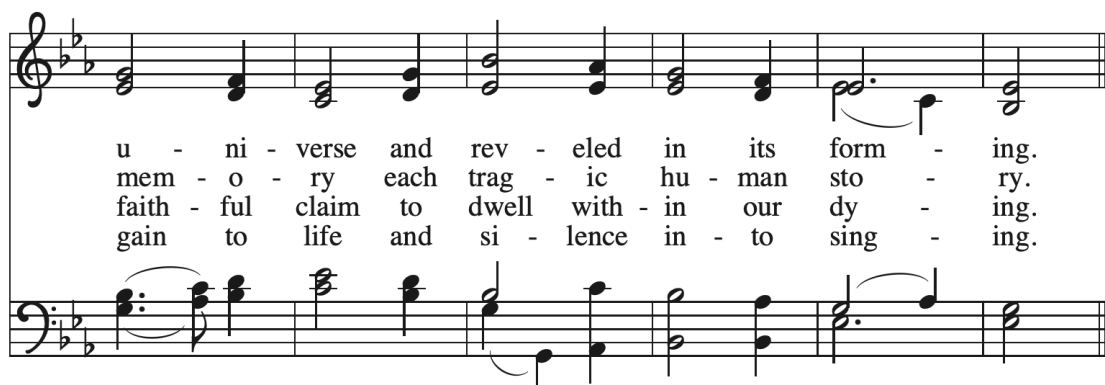

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Music Notes:

The **Prelude** starts with Cathy Moglebust's masterful and serene setting of "Thy Holy Wings." Ms. Moglebust has developed and directed handbell music programs since 1983, with more than 400 compositions and arrangements in print. Her music has been broadcast on the "Today" and "Good Morning, America" television programs. She holds her BA and M. Ed degrees from South Dakota State University. Next we hear an arrangement by Doug Wagner of a tune by Jay Ungar. It's a Bell Choir favorite (ask who says, "Oh, I love this one!" every time we ring it). "Ashokan Farewell" was made popular by the Ken Burns series, "The Civil War." It's a haunting and restful melody that will be going through your head for days. Mr. Wagner (b. 1952) spent 30 years as a secondary school music teacher and administrator before turning full-time to composing and editing, having produced over 2,400 titles that have sold more than 14 million copies to date.

As the **Last Prelude**, we hear an arrangement by Hal Hopson of Cesar Franck's famous "Panis Angelicus" (sung in English, freely adapted by Hopson). Franck was a French composer, pianist, organist and music teacher of the Romantic period. He was associated with organs built by Aristide Cavaille-Coll (1811-1899). He became the organist at Sainte-Clotilde in Paris in 1859 and professor at the Paris Conservatoire in 1872. He is best known for the Symphony in D minor, the Violin Sonata, and the piece we hear today. Hopson (b. 1933) is a full-time composer and church musician with over 3,000 published works. One of his compositions, a cantata called "God with Us," was placed in a time capsule during the American Bicentennial in 1976 to be opened in 2076.

The **Postlude** is by Matt and Beth Redman, Matt Redman and Beth are married and have five children. They are based on the south coast of England. Matt has been a full-time worship leader since the age of 20 and this journey has taken him to countries such as South Africa, Japan, India, Australia, Germany and the Czech Republic. Matt is also the author of several books, including *The Unquenchable Worshipper*, *Facedown*, *Mirrorball*, *Blessed Be Your Name* (co-authored with Beth Redman) and *Indescribable* (co-authored with Louie Giglio).

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Rosamond E. Herklots (1905-1987) in 1966. Born in Masuri, North India, educated at Leeds University, and was secretary to a neurologist and part of the head office of the Association for Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus in London. The tune, "Detroit," is a nearly pentatonic (think the black notes on a keyboard). It was first published in 1820 without attribution.
