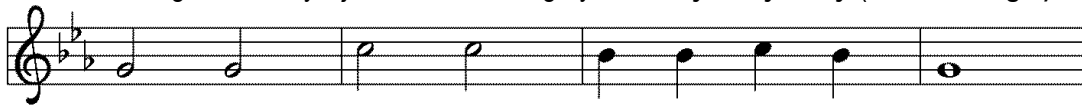

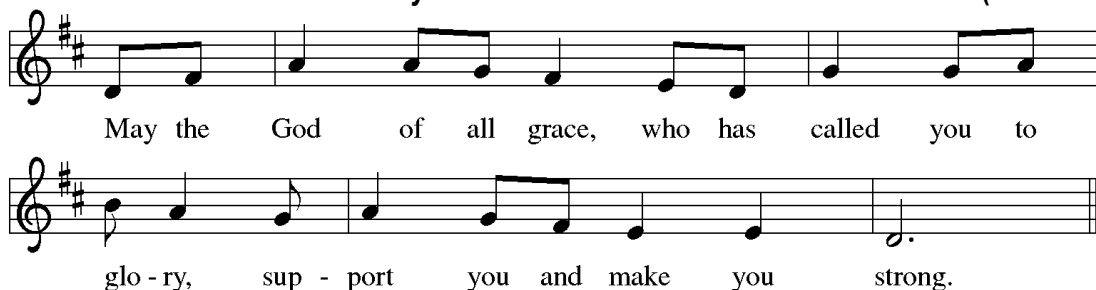

Music Notes:

The **Prelude** is a song from the Hillsong album, “Let There Be Light,” released in 2016. The inspiration for the lyrics came from Hebrews 1:1-4 and Colossians 1:15-20, 26-27. The song won two Dove Awards in 2017. In response to the criticism that verse 2 could be read as saying that God “needs” us, Ben Fielding wrote, “In verse 2, we wanted to describe the love of God, who, though in need of nothing, so loved the world that He chose to send His one and only Son, so that we may not perish but have eternal life with Him.”

The **Last Prelude** is a new song for the Band this year. It's by Jennie Lee Riddle with lyrics adapted from the book of Revelation Chapter 4. It was released by Phillips, Craig and Dean in 2009 as the lead single from their album *Fearless*, hitting No. 1 on Billboard's Hot Christian Songs chart, becoming the longest-running No. 1 song on Christian radio that year.

During **Distribution**, we hear a song from the Sidewalk Prophets album, “Something Different,” released in 2015. The band got its start leading worship in their college chapel at Anderson University in Indiana, and today they have three studio albums, five #1 hits and eight Top 5 songs under their belts.

As the **Postlude**, the Band offers a selection from Passion's album, “White Flag”. The album was recorded live in 2012 with 42,000 college students in Atlanta, led by Kristian Stanfill. Mr. Stanfill (b. 1983) is an American contemporary singer-songwriter and self-taught guitarist, who has been a worship leader since his teens.

The **Hymn of the Day** was written by Erik Routley to fill a need in 1962 for “hymns for our time” on the subject of “Christian Aid.” Dr. Routley was considered the premier 20th Century hymnologist. Educated at Oxford and later ordained, he served as a minister, lecturer and ultimately president of the Congregational Church in England and Wales.
