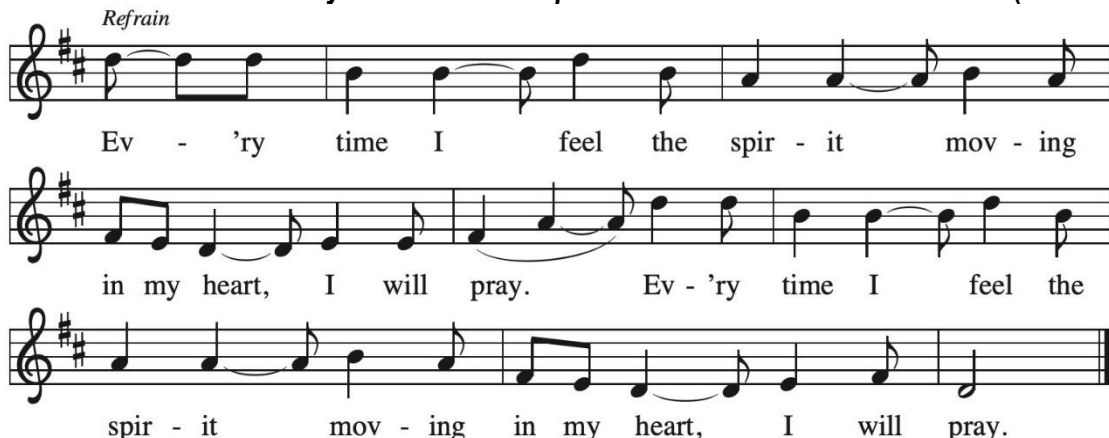

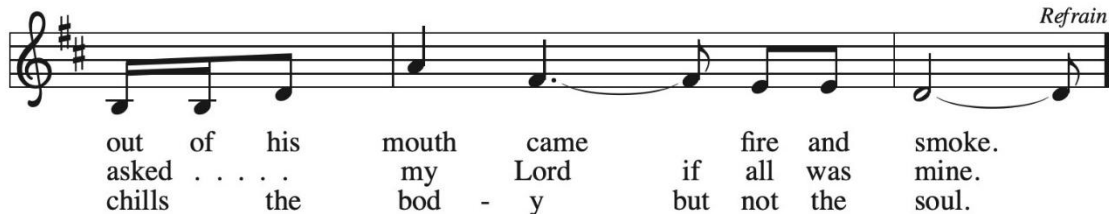

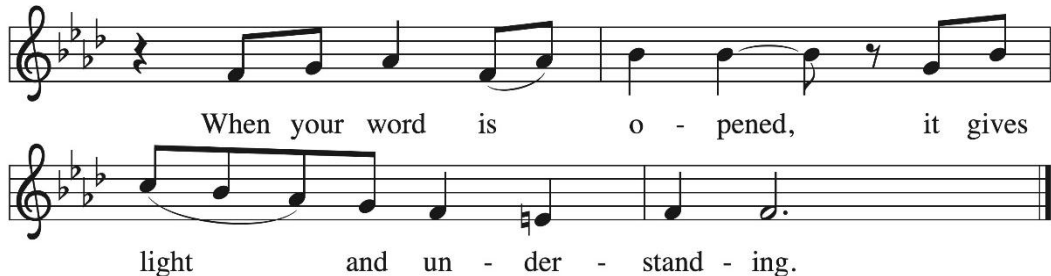
FIRST READING 1 Kings 3:5-12

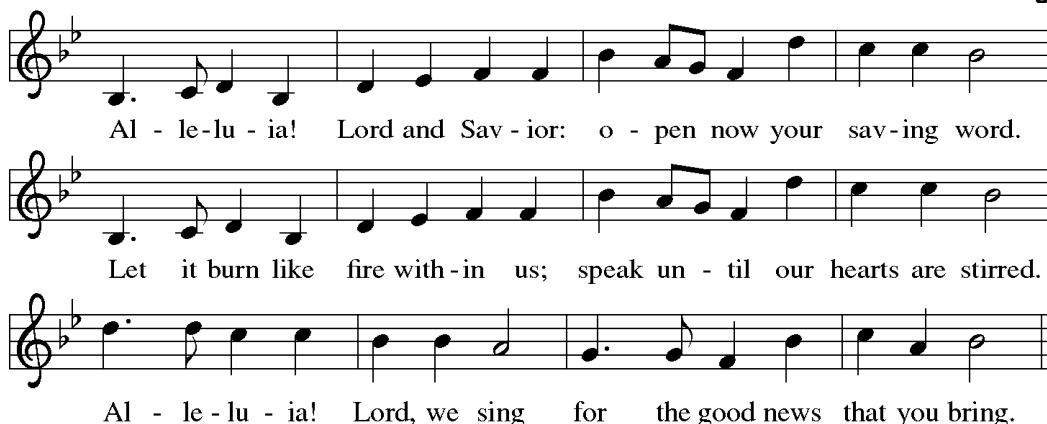

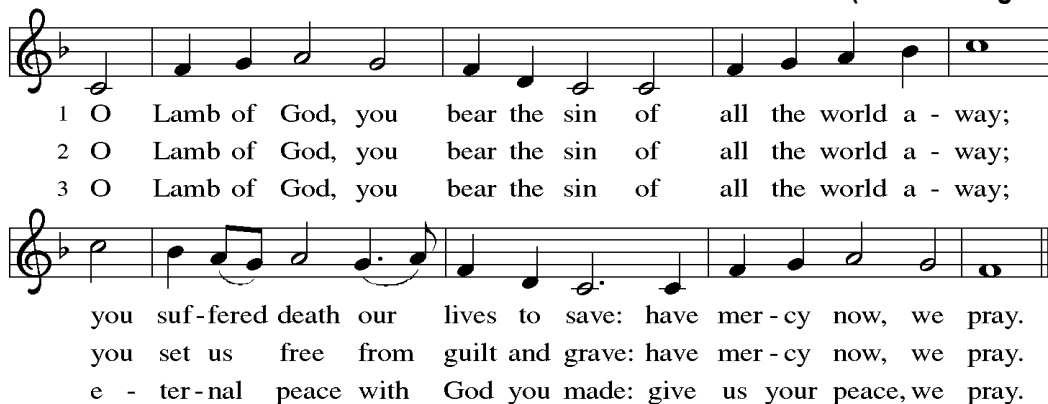

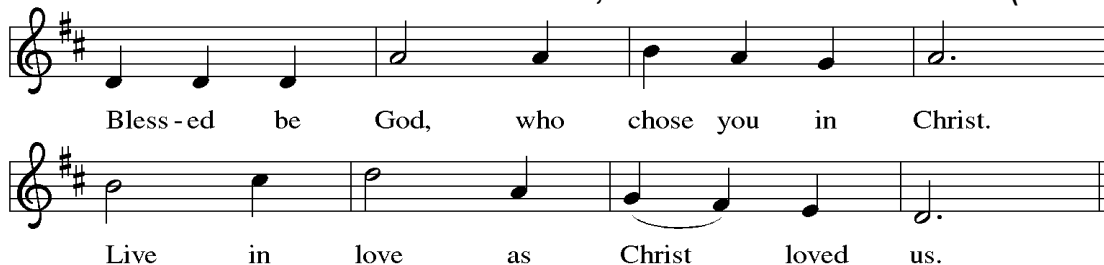

Please take a moment after worship to let Steve Karthaus know how much we appreciate his leadership of the group while Mr. Dearing is on vacation.

The **Prelude** is a song from Kari Jobe's album, "Majestic." Ms. Jobe writes on her Facebook page that she "began writing this song in Australia with Marty Sampson and Mia Fieldes...[she] took the song back to the [United] States and felt led to finish it with [her] band...[they] felt a common theme telling [them] to remind people in the congregation that God goes before us, fighting for us (see Exodus 14:14: 'The lord will fight for you; you need only be still')... The verses all come from Psalm 23, Exodus 14:14, and Isaiah 43."

The **Last Prelude** is an American spiritual song recorded by many artists in a variety of genres (including on the Crowder album, "Milk and Honey"). The version we hear this morning is the version by Crowder, but played more in the style of Mississippi John Hurt. Other famous covers include Dr. John, Ike & Tina Turner, Roy Acuff, and The Byrds. The congregation's own guest drummer, Dawn-Mark Bacon-Johnson, plays our new electronic drums set for this one.

During **Distribution**, the Band offers a song by The Afters, of which band member Matt Fuqua wrote: "We hope you all are enjoying our song and video for 'Lift Me Up!' The word of God is one of the best places to receive that encouragement from the Lord each day, so I wanted to share one of my favorite verses that has always lifted me up! The passage of scripture that comes to mind when I think of 'Lift Me Up' is Psalm 23. I memorized it when I was a kid, and a few years ago when I was going through some hard times, I remembered that passage and would quote it to myself. It never failed to remind me that God is with me, and loves me, and would always lift me up."

The **Postlude** is a catchy song by Zach Williams. It's from Zach's album, "Chain Breaker." Born in Jonesboro, Arkansas, Williams took a detour from his "storybook childhood" through the "illusion of rock stardom," and the drug and alcohol excesses that can so often accompany that lifestyle. Now a husband and father, he is an established Contemporary Christian artist with three Grammy Awards.

The **Hymn of the Day** is a Spiritual arranged by Melva W. Costen (1933-2023), who holds a PhD in Music from Georgia State University. She is an elder in The Presbyterian Church USA and chaired the committee that created *The Presbyterian Hymnal* (1990).
