Volunteer Opportunities

Befriender Volunteer - our Volunteer Befrienders are able to offer friendship and support and form a positive one-to-one relationship with vulnerable adults who may be experiencing isolation in their life.

Friends of Serve Community Volunteer - to work as part of a team on fundraising events at adhoc times throughout the year from outdoor fetes, stalls, displays to Serve Goes Dancing.

Gardening Volunteer – to assist in the Big Lottery Community Fund project in lawn mowing, hedge cutting, weeding, digging, strimming and in ensuring that the garden is safe to use.

Minibus Driver - to drive our minibuses for outings, classes and other activities required.

Minibus Escort for Day Trips - to escort our Service Users on outings to pubs, shopping, garden centres etc during minibus journey and to assist with access meals if required.

Patient Transport Volunteer - to provide transport to medical appointments for passengers who have no access to, or difficulty using, public transport. Drivers use their own cars and are refunded travelling expenses.

Reception Volunteer at Rushden - to receive incoming telephone calls and be the first point of contact when people visit our building and make a positive impression.

Shopping Volunteer - to assist Service Users by purchasing their grocery shopping and taking it into their home for them.

Wellbeing Activity Assistant in Rushden - to assist Service Users taking part in a wellbeing session with a tutor; session examples include crafts/digital dodger/musical moments.

Event/Fundraising Volunteer - to attend events on behalf of Serve to help sell Raffle Tickets, run Tombola and support Serve staff at events. You can also take part in fundraising events and will be fully supported by Serve. This may suit many who want to help but can't commit because of other things going on in their lives, but every now and then can; if that's you, then come on board, even if you can only help once or twice a year; every little helps. This is ideal if you feel you can't always work as part of a team.

Message from Jess Slater CEO



Coming out of the pandemic has been a real eye opener at SERVE, and more than ever we have noticed that the beneficiaries' needs are changing. SERVE embraced the challenge of the pandemic, and more services were set up to tackle isolation and loneliness such as the Countywide Befriending Service, Meals on Wheels and the new gardening project 'servescape'. The local authorities and other funders have supported us to set up and deliver effective services to enable us to support as many people as possible.

Nationally, the pandemic put charities like SERVE on the map and they have been identified as being crucial to support people with the health and wellbeing. The government have known for some time that the wider determinants of health such as housing, employment, isolation, financial advice, plus many more determinants contribute to poor health and as a result more people end up in hospital or contacting their GP to try a resolve their problems.

As a result, the new Health & Care Act 2022 introduced the Integrated Care System legislation, there are 42 integrated care systems in the UK and Northamptonshire is one of them.Integrated Care Systems have existed informally in some capacity since 2016, and the new legislation means it is the responsibility of the NHS and local government to deliver joined up health and care services that include a wide range of partnerships including the voluntary sector to provide suitable placed-based services to suit the needs of local communities.

What does this mean for you?

In broad terms, the aim of integrated care is to join up health and care services required by individuals, to deliver care that meet their needs in an efficient way.

This is easier said than done, because health and care services are made up of many constituent parts, and arrangements for delivering and funding them are complicated. Treatment and care for a single problem can require care from GPs, ambulance and hospital services, and a range of

professionals working in the community including nurses, therapists and home carers. This is a mammoth task for the NHS and local authorities, but the process is underway and there has already been some major changes to way services will be delivered in future.


In summary, over the next few years you should see better ways of working and more locality-based services delivering local area priorities.



What is SERVE's role in the changes?

SERVE in partnership with charities; Support Northamptonshire and Groundworks is supporting the local authority with engagement In the community, bringing together local voluntary organisations so they can learn about the changes and what it will mean for them as charities and more importantly what it will mean to the people they support in the community.

As partners, we are holding engagement events across North Northamptonshire, there will be five altogether across Kettering, Corby, East Northants, Wellingborough and Black Communities. Wellingborough's event on Wednesday 21st September 2022 was well represented across the voluntary sector with over 50 representatives in attendance.

SERVE has appointed a new Operations Manager, a new post within SERVE.

The successful candidate was Matthew Pemberton who started work with SERVE on 22/07/2022.

Born and raised in Stoke on Trent, Matthew is from a musical family, a long term pupil of the Royal Northerns Professor of Strings Rudolph Botta he won key roles in leading County and National music groups and was a graduate of the University of Huddersfield.

To fund studies Matthew became a staff and area trainer for a national company, writing a training manual still in use today. On relocating to the south of England, he worked in local government helping to structure new departments. This led to similar roles in private industry using knowledge of legislation and process development at several large companies.

Later he worked on a university project to identify systems to enable students to manage learning more effectively. Working across three faculties Matthew developed his understanding of working with large council bodies, projects and governance structures. Designing and implementing changes throughout these roles.

A sideline to Matthews development came when he was invited to become a guest lecturer, presenting to Master level professional bodies on the rigours and disciplines of professional performers and its applications in the working world.

Prior to joining SERVE, Matthew worked to rebuild a small company from its foundations into a business that can adapt and change through robust practices and cross trained staff. He also worked in a senior operations position for a Bedfordshire based charity and has spent several years volunteering for a charity in Buckinghamshire.

Outside of work Matthew is a keen cyclist to counter the effects of working at a desk. And when not attempting various DIY projects he is currently rebuilding a 3.5inch steam train built in 1952 by his grandfather.

Befriending Service

More of us than ever before are lonely or socially isolated. We are continuing to change that through our Befriending Service.

During August – September we received 87 referrals into the service and delivered 1,785 volunteer hours. These hours are so important for our service users as it helps to reduce the negative impact of loneliness and isolation. In return it increases the positivity of mental health and wellbeing on everyone involved, especially our volunteers.

One of a volunteer befriender's shared:



Currently we have 51 people on our waiting list who have been referred into the Befriending Service. We all experience loneliness and isolation in our lives, and we all react differently depending on our circumstances, support network, and coping methods. Volunteering is a way to help with maintaining good mental health, healthy wellbeing and better connections. We have different ways you could help.

If you or someone you know could provide a minimum of 1 hour a week to visit an older person in their own home, we want to hear from you. You can even invite someone to have a chat with us about volunteering as a Befriender. If our current team of volunteers did this, we could double in size and meet the growing needs.

Servescape Update

Servescape continues to grow. Referrals have been coming in and the work achieved so far has been very much welcomed. We currently have 67 active gardening jobs underway.

Jenni is now Project Coordinator, providing day-to-day support to Scott (Project Worker) and Lisa (Project Administrator). Jonathan supports the team as Servescape Supervisor concentrating on strategic direction and growth. We now have two regular volunteers supporting the service.

Servescape is a community gardening project supported by the Big Lottery Community Fund. We are providing this service to support older people to look after their gardens that will be maintained monthly.

There have been opportunities over the past months to promote the service through Serve's social media platforms (Facebook and LinkedIn) and connecting with educational institutions to help with volunteer placement opportunities. More recently, we have been posting on social media hints and tips about maintaining your garden.

To access Servescape one of the following criteria must be met: Service User is in receipt of Pension Credit, 65+ living alone, and are carers supporting a disabled person in their own home. There is a small annual membership of £25 and an hourly charge of £10 per hour.

The service does require volunteers to help and support Scott when he goes on visits. If you enjoy being part of a team, keen to learn new gardening skills or want to share your gardening expertise with us, would like to help us meet the needs of older people in your community to safely use their gardens, we want to hear from you.

We are beginning to develop and promote our Handy-Help service as part of Servescape to support with installing key safes, grab rails, fence repairs along with other outdoor minor adaptations as needed and any small jobs that need doing around the house. Annual membership and hourly charge will still apply.

TRANSPORT

Increasingly our customers are receiving weekend appointments, which are difficult for us to provide drivers for.

Generally, our drivers work weekdays, and we often need to make special requests. Although our committed drivers help out, this is not always possible. It would be great to hear from you and welcome you to the team.

We would like to thank you for your patience with a few changes to our phone lines and booking system. Our phone lines can be very busy so please bare with us and do keep trying.

Transport bookings are now taken between 9am and 1pm only. Our answerphone is for cancellations ONLY, we cannot take bookings from any messages left.
