FUNDING

NNC has a new Rural Community Capital Funding round opening from March 4th to April 2nd. There is £217,840 available from the Shared Prosperity Fund and the criteria is as follows:

The creation of or improvements to local rural green spaces, existing cultural, historic and heritage institutions and active travel enhancements e.g. community transport

Organisations will be able to apply for up to £20,000 and must be in a rural area of North Northamptonshire.

Here at NHFT we offer the opportunity to complete the ImROC Peer Support Worker Training Course prior to applying for a role, whilst the training does not lead directly into a paid role, the course provides trainees with the knowledge and skills needed, as well as helping trainees to decide if the role is for them. 

- It ensures that volunteers are equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills to respand to emergencies effectively, which can save lives and reduce the impact of disasters.
- Training helps valunteers to understand their roles and responsibilities during an emergency, which can prevent confusion and improve coordination among responders.
- Training can boost volunteers' confidence and reduce anxiety, enabling them to perform their duties more effectively.
- Training can help valunteers to develop new skills, which can be useful in their personal and professional lives.
- Trained valunteers can serve as ambassadors for emergency preparedness in their communities, promoting awareness and encouraging others to get involved.
- Training is essential for emergency key skills volunteers to ensure they are prepared and capable of responding to emergencies and serving their communities.





Safeguarding is ...

Safeguarding is a term used in the United Kingdom and Ireland to denote measures to protect the health, well-being and human rights of individuals, which allow people — especially children, young people and vulnerable adults — to live free from abuse, harm and neglect.

The training will involve -

- Be aware of key guidance to safeguarding.
- Recognising tell-tale signs of abuse and neglect.
- Improve your communication ability.
- Know what to do if you have a concern about the safety and welfare of someone.



Community Responder Volunteer

We need you to make a difference to older people.

This service aims to provide company, reassurance, and low-level support to an older vulnerable person in their own home. This could be anything from a welfare check to offering some companionship when a delay is anticipated for Primary or Secondary care support. It can be a worrying time when older people are waiting for further support at home, our aim is to assign a volunteer to be that much needed "friendly face" for up to two hours.

This service currently covers Northampton and Wellingborough and the surrounding areas, including East Northamptonshire.

To join this rewarding service, we ask that you are:-

- age 18 or over
- a confident caring person with empathy for older people
- able to stay calm and offer reassurance
- living locally in the current service area

Your visit could include:-

- making a drink
- packing an overnight bag
- making someone comfortable following a fall
- contacting a family member or friend
- providing reassurance and a listening ear
- liaising with your Service Manager as required

Please note this role will not involve any manual handling (lifting or moving) of people. We are sure that you will enjoy volunteering with us, and that you will always feel supported and safe.

North Northants Family Hubs has commissioned Anna Freud, a children's mental health charity, to collaboratively develop:

a perinatal mental health and parent-infant relationships strategy, and
 an infant feeding support action plan.

The project is our first opportunity to take a deep dive into perinatal mental health, infant feeding, parent-infant relationships, and related services. Your input, experiences, feedback, and reflections are crucial for this project's success. While we've made several requests in a short period due to the rapid transformation, it will not be a constant demand as we shift to normal operations in the coming months. Your participation at this stage is appreciated.

The work will bring together the experiences, insights and perspectives of local families, service providers and commissioners. It will build on the many strengths and assets of the local area and will place the voice of the infant at the heart of the work at every stage.
