Overall Role	Our Volunteer Befrienders are able to offer friendship and support and form a positive one-to-one relationship with vulnerable adults who may be experiencing isolation in their life.
Main Tasks	
Key Responsibilities	<ul> <li>Being available to volunteer for a minimum of one hour per week</li> <li>Building a sensitive and caring relationship with the service user</li> <li>Spending time with the service user and engaging in activities that are mutually agreed upon (i.e. chatting, playing a board game, watching TV)</li> <li>Being understanding rather than judgmental about a service user's situation or circumstances</li> <li>Respecting the confidentiality of service users at all times</li> <li>Establishing and maintaining appropriate boundaries</li> <li>Attending induction training and participation in ongoing training activities/networking meetings</li> <li>Respecting different cultural values and working in a non-discriminatory manner</li> <li>Meeting the Befriending Coordinator for feedback and support</li> <li>Informing the Befriending Coordinator of any concerns about the service user</li> </ul>
Person Specification	<ul> <li>Ability to commit to the project</li> <li>Ability to listen to and communicate with service users, other volunteers and staff</li> <li>To be reliable and keep all commitments or appointments with the service users</li> <li>Ability to maintain service users confidentiality</li> <li>Ability to share skills, interests or activities with the service users</li> <li>To be respectful of the service user's individuality</li> <li>Awareness and/or understanding of the key issues facing the service user</li> <li>Prepared to share information</li> </ul>
