


Our Goals as CHW Ambassadors

CHWs Are Essential

CHWs serve essential roles, in healthcare, bridging the gaps between healthcare systems and the community



I What is a CHW?

Valued part of the health team

Frontline liaison guiding individuals through health, social, community services systems

Fosters health and well-being



Trusted community member

Sensitive to the demographics and experiences of the community

Provides culturally & linguistically competent and appropriate services



Outreach & Education

Approaches to connect with underserved populations and conduct health promotion and disease prevention education

Coaching & Social Support

Individual support,
motivation, encouragement
to support self-management
of health

Care Coordination

Coordinate care through making referrals, providing follow-up, addressing barriers, and documenting

Advocacy

Advocate for the needs and perspectives of communities; connect to resources and advocate for basic needs; conduct policy advocacy




Benefits of CHWs

- CHWs are cost effective: For every dollar invested in CHW programs, there is a proven return on investment (ROI) ranging from \$1.80 to \$2.47
- CHWs have been shown to reduce ED visits, hospital readmissions, and nursing home placements
- CHWs improve chronic disease management
- CHWs make vital conditions to preventive care and screenings
- CHWs improve self-reported health and well-being, decreasing the number of poor mental and physical health days


CHWs are Highly Skilled

Core Competency Training

CHWs complete extensive training on nationally recognized core skills and roles

Relationship - Builders

CHWs are experts at connecting with those in their community and building trusting relationships through cultural & linguistic humility



Knowledge Base

CHWs are knowledgeable about social drivers of health, chronic disease, and navigating care systems

Certification

Formal CHW Certification ensure CHWs across the state demonstrate shared skills and knowledge (coming Fall 2025)




