Congressman Pocan's office is here to help you find out if you, or someone you know, qualify for support today.

FoodShare Wisconsin, also known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), is a federally funded program that helps people buy the food they need.

932,312 Wisconsinites claimed their FoodShare benefits in 2022, but many, including two-thirds of seniors, have not yet enrolled.

FoodShare is based on your household size and monthly income, including any money you earn from Social Security or Veterans Benefits. For example, a senior couple with an annual income of less than \$40,000, including Social Security, may be eligible.
