POLICY AND PERSONNEL COMMITTEE REPORT

In March of 2018, John Hall tendered his resignation as Building & Maintenance Coordinator to take the job as Director of Hesed House of Hope. Policy and Personnel committee met on April 16th to begin the process for his replacement. After much discussion, it was decided to split the responsibilities of this position. Following instructions in the By-Laws, a letter was sent to member churches notifying them of the new positions, Building & Resource Coordinator, and Coordinator of Volunteers. The committee met on April 16th, and reviewed the applications received and decided that an offer would be made to Richard Ballard for Resource and Building Coordinator, and to Woody Saunders for the Coordinator of Volunteers. Both men accepted the positions.

The following recommendations were made to the Board at the November meeting:

- 2019 staff salary/wages
- 2018 Christmas bonus increased to \$750 per position
- Bonus fund based on 2019 receipts to be distributed in the first quarter of 2020
- Full audit to be conducted for 2018

Our committee has been very active this year- praying for God's guidance and direction. We feel the Ministry is blessed to have such qualified personnel in leadership positions. Thank you to Steve Miller, Ralph Zello, Rev. Gregg Plott, Charles Stevens, Rob Allen-Ex Officio, for being so faithful and diligent in our efforts to keep the clients and their needs out front as we search for new leadership who could cover their responsibilities and continue to show love and respect to our clients, our reason for existence- SERVING GOD BY SERVING OTHERS.

EMERGENCY SERVICES MINISTRY GROUP REPORT

Purpose: Aide/assist clients with emergency needs (food, medicine, heating/Cooling bills, burned out families, clothing/shoes — through the Ministry Clothing Closet, as well as vouchers given to go to the Good Neighbor Shop).

In 2018, we served 8,086 families and 21,972 individuals, as well as the variety of services listed above. Please read carefully the EMS Statistical Report for the full impact that this ministry has on individual lives. Due to the resignation of John Hall as Resource and Building Coordinator, Richard Ballard applied and was hired as Resource and Building Coordinator. **Thank you** to all individuals, churches, businesses and volunteers for your involvement in making all this possible.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to each volunteer who helped make my new position of Coordinator of Volunteers a success. We are thankful for so many volunteers; it's not just about giving through service, but is a way of life. Because of your generous gift of time, energy and patience, we have improved the service to our clients with better organization of resources and consistent volunteer participation. Volunteer participation takes many forms. We have had twenty-six days of school and youth group service. Businesses and organizations have lent their service to the ministry nine days. There are currently thirty-seven scheduled pantry, food dock and grocery pick-up volunteers that work a minimum of one day a month. THE LINC HOME MEALS PROGRAM

2018 proved to be another good year for our LINC Home Delivered Meals program. We have a great group of around 250 volunteers that continue to minister to the needs of those in our community daily by delivering a hot meal, a kind hello and a warm smile.

These volunteers pack and drive for 13 routes all across Lincoln County, they delivered 18,129 meals. They served over 5600 volunteer hours and drove an estimated 111,000 miles.

Of the 18,129 meals that were delivered, 13,294 of those were free to the recipient. These meals cost \$55,834.80. Our LINC Meals budget is only \$22,000. This left \$33,834.80 that was paid by donations and our Amazing Race fundraiser. We have several dedicated supporters that are faithful to give to our program each month to help offset the cost of these meals and we are very grateful to these churches, individuals and businesses.

MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

In 2018, Christian Ministry continued to work with churches to offer food to those in need that could not get to the Ministry. This year, an estimated amount of 60,000 lbs. of food was distributed with a retail value of \$18,600. This was done in partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB) and three member churches. Working with the churches, the Ministry schedules a food drop from SHFB on a Friday. The churches have volunteers at the church to help store the food away, then on Saturday morning, the volunteers give the food to clients. Over the past year, 2106 families (6137 individuals) where helped through this ministry.
