Governance



Governance - Governing Board

Governing Board is focused on Missional Oversight and Policy Governance

8 Member Board (voice & vote)	Ex-Officio Members (voice, but no vote)
 4 Officers: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary 	Clergy Executive Director
4 At-Large Members	1 Youth Position (Jr or Sr in HS)

Standing Committees are appointed by the Board to focus on research and planning within a defined topic, with no decision-making authority.

O Finance & Investments, Personnel, Stewardship, Nominating, Governance, Building Care, etc...

Ad-hoc Task Forces are appointed by the Board to investigate special topics and key issues.

O These groups have no decision-making authority and are temporary while there is a specific need.





Governance – Ministries


Ministries at Union are:

- O The power of the church, doing the work of the church, including Fellowship
- Aligned with Union's Statement of Purpose (Mission Statement)
- O Aligned with Union's Annual Mission Priorities (Voted on by Congregation at Annual Meeting)
- O Overseen by Clergy, who represents them on the Governing Board
- O Successful through volunteering from congregation, with fewer or no regular meetings
- Organized into several main Ministry Areas

Small Groups create opportunities to grow spiritually, have fun, and care for each other.

O These groups are a subset of ministry teams and may exist without clergy or staff involvement.

Executive Director*	-Hired by and reports to Governing BoardSupervises Administrative Staff to achieve Mission GoalsFocuses on Institutional/Financial Fiduciary ResponsibilitiesWorks with Treasurer to develop budget proposalsIn collaboration with Governing Board, oversees Standing Committees.	
Ministry Teams*	-Execute Mission GoalsReport to and Collaborate with Clergy & Staff	
Standing Committees*	-Report to Governing Board and Executive DirectorBring research & policy recommendations to Governing Board in advisory capacity.	

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Governance - Areas for Continued Definition



Governance Timeline - Next 6 Months





Mission Driven Groups






