Louisiana Fishing License

If you plan on fishing at Palmetto Island State Park, you do need a fishing license if you are 16 years of age or older. 2018-2019 fishing licenses will be expiring June 30, 2019. New licenses will be good till June 30, 2020. Licenses can be purchased online at the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries or at local license vendors (*Bon Ami Grocery*).

Anglers are also invited to take part in the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries **Free Fishing Weekend** on Saturday, June 8 and Sunday, June 9. The weekend is an opportunity for Louisiana residents and visitors alike to fish Louisiana waters without an otherwise required fishing license. While a fishing license is not required, all fishing regulations, including size, season, catch limits and gear restrictions will remain in effect. When in doubt, regulations can be looked up on the LDWF web sight.

LATANIER COOKERS' D.O.G. 'CHOW'

CORN - A - COPIA submitted by James Menard

1/2 lb bacon, cut into 1" pieces
1 whole chicken breast, chunked
1 c. onions, chopped
1/2 c. bell pepper, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 can (8 oz.) tomato sauce
1 can green peas, drained



1/2 lb smoked sausage, large diced
1 can cut okra, drained (*opt)
1/2 c. celery, chopped
1/4 c. green onion tops, chopped (*opt)
1 can Rotel tomatoes
3 cans shoe peg corn, drained
1 1/2 cup chicken broth

Fry bacon over medium heat until slightly crispy. Remove bacon from drippings and brown sausage and breast. Set aside with bacon. (*Add drained okra and fry in drippings until brown and not slimy.) Add onions, celery, peppers, *onion tops and garlic to drippings, cook until wilted. Add tomatoes and sauce, cook for about 10 min. to thicken. Add corn, peas, meats and 1/2 c. broth. Stir well and reduce heat to simmer. Cover tightly, cook for 30 min., stir occasionally, add broth as necessary. Taste and add seasoning to your liking.

NOTES: This dish can be doubled, served as a side or served over rice as a main meal. To serve over rice, add broth to your liking for gravy.

I FOUND A BABY MAMMAL...*NOW WHAT?*

IS THE BABY MAMMAL HURT OR SICK?

(bleeding, shivering, vomiting; was attacked by cat/dog?)

Call an LDWF licensed wildlife rehabilitator* (contact info on back) or licensed wildlife veterinarian **PRIOR** to intervening.

CAN YOU FIND THE NEST OR DEN? IS IT INTACT?

PLACE BABY BACK IN NEST OR DEN

MAKE A SUBSTITUTE NEST/DEN

Place baby in shallow box close to where it was found making certain to add drain holes to bottom of box. Keep it warm but out of sun.

LEAVE THE AREA
Baby is OK

OBSERVE FOR 4-6 HOURS. DID THE MOTHER RETURN?

Stay completely out of sight. Mothers won't return if any people or pets are present.

In Louisiana, it is against the law to possess injured/orphaned mammals without an LDWF Rehabilitation permit, even if you plan to release them. It is also against the law to possess/import/export wildlife as pets or for the pet trade in Louisiana.

Park Hours of Operation:

Gates are open 6am-9pm (Sun-Thurs) and 6am-10pm (Fri & Sat). **Entrance station** is open: 8am-5pm (Sun-Thur) 8am-10pm (Fri & Sat). All park sites close at 10pm on Friday, Saturday and days preceding holidays. **Entrance Fees:** \$3 per person; Free for Seniors (62 and older) and children age 3 and under. **Canoe** rentals are \$25 per day or \$7 per hour. The **Splashpad** is open April-September, Tuesday –Sunday from 8am to 8pm. **Golf cart** entry fees are \$10 per day or \$100 for annual pass (*proof of insurance is required*). Palmetto Island State Park has **96 camp sites**, **6 cabins**, **4 pavilions**, **4 primitive backpack sites**, **1 primitive group site** and a **meeting room** to rent. **Reservations** for overnight accommodations at Palmetto Island State Park can be made [online](http://www.lastateparks.com) or through the Call Center at 877.226.7652.
