

Recipe Correr

Cheery Cauliflower and Bean Soup

This soup is perfect on a cold day. Freeze half for another week of lunch. Feel free to change up the cheese to your favorite!

Directions

1. Heat oil in Dutch oven over medium. Add onion. Cooked for 5 minutes until soft. Add garlic, sage, and thyme. Cook 1 minute. Stir in cauliflower, broth, beans, cheese, pepper,



and salt. Bring to boil. Reduce to simmer. Cover and cook 15 minutes.

- 2. Puree soup in blender or using immersion blender until smooth. Add sherry vinegar.
- 3. Serve with crumbled bacon.

Ingredients:

- 2 TBS extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp minced fresh sage
- 2 tsp minced fresh thyme
- 16 oz riced cauliflower, cooked
- 4 cups low sodium chicken or vegetable broth
- 15 oz can no salt added white beans, rinsed
- 2 oz goat cheese
- ⅓ cup shredded Harvarti
- ⅓ cup shredded Parmesan
- ½ tsp ground pepper
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ tsp sherry vinegar
- 4 sliced cooked bacon, crumbled

The Moveable Alphabet

The purpose of the Movable Alphabet is to prepare children for writing, reading, and spelling. Objects or pictures are usually used alongside this material. Children look at the picture and sound it out and choose the letter that they hear.

In a Montessori environment we teach letter sounds, not letter names. The letter sounds are what children need to begin their reading journey.

The Movable Alphabet is a beautiful material that is found in a 3-6 environment and in early elementary.
