Recipe Corner

Savory Morning Mulfins

- Adapted from Valerie Bertinelli

These muffins are great for a morning snack, packed full of protein and healthy fats. Make ahead and keep in the freezer. Using almond flour, they are gluten free and denser than regular muffins.

Ingredients:

6 TBS unsalted butter, melted and cooled

1.5 cups almond flour

2 tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

1/2 tsp dried sage

½ cup cooked, crumbled breakfast

sausage

½ cup shredded cheddar

3 TBS whole milk


2 large eggs, whisked

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Line muffin pan with butter or paper muffin cups.
- 2. Whisk together almond flour, baking powder, salt, and sage.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine sausage and cheddar. Add eggs and milk to mixture and combine. Add butter and flour mixture and blend.
- 4. Spoon batter into muffin pan. Bake for 15 mixture until golden brown and toothpick comes out clean.
