

Classroom Expectations

Please drop off your child on time each day. It is important for your child to get used to their new routine, and consistency is key. When a child is late, it interrupts the flow of our classroom and makes the late child feel uncomfortable and rushed. While we understand life happens, please make it a priority to bring your child to school on time. Our class begins at 9:00 am and will end at 11:30 am daily.

Please dress your child appropriately in clothes they feel comfortable in. Clothing should not restrict a child from running and playing freely. We will often use paint and other art materials, as well as allow children to play in the dirt and mud outside. Please do not send your child in nice clothes that cannot get dirty.

Please leave toys and other belongings at home. The classroom is filled with amazing materials for your child to explore. If your child is staying for naptime, a stuffed animal and or small blanket is the only exception to this rule. They will remain in their backpack until your child is ready to nap. If your child will stay for naptime, please send a blanket to remain at school. The blanket will be washed weekly.

We will provide snacks and water for your children throughout the day. If your child is staying for Splendid Days, please provide them with a nutritious lunch. We are happy to warm up your child's food in the microwave, but please do not send them with food that needs to be cooked.

Birthday Celebrations

Children love to be remembered and cherished on the special day they were born. The Montessori Celebration of Life is a lovely way to celebrate a child's birthday at school. Children enjoy hearing about their journey from birth to present day. They love listening to stories, looking at photos, and remembering special milestones and events. They want to know how cherished and important they are. Each child makes the world, and our classroom, a better place. The Montessori Celebration of Life is the perfect way to share this with your child.

In our classroom, we use a wooden sun, visual representation of the months, candles, and a globe to demonstrate the passage of time, as well as each child's growth from birth to this birthday celebration. The birthday child will walk around the sun for each year of life. Our class will sing a sweet birthday song as he or she walks around the sun. Each time around, he or she will pause, and teachers will read a memory/milestone provided by you for your child.

In preparation for the Montessori Celebration of Life, please provide a picture for each year of your child's life, and write a short life story to accompany each picture. We ask that these be brought into school two days before the child's celebration. We want every child to have the opportunity to experience the Celebration of Life during the school year. Children born during the summer months will celebrate their "half birthday".
