Purpose



- This is the Empowering LGBT+ Older Adults To Find Affirming Long-Term
 Care or Home Health Services Group Project
 - Our purpose is to aid and assist older LGBT+ adults by finding places that are more inclusive, and give guidelines for further improvement to each long term care community (LTCC) in Knox County, Tennessee in partnership with the Aging Rainbow Coalition (ARC), an LGBT+ aging advocacy organization.
 - Older LGBT+ adults have information needs and related barriers¹ concerning issues that cisgender heterosexual older adults do not. Such as can I have my partner live with me/visit me even if we're the same gender?
 Can I get gender affirming care? Will me being LGBT+ be a non-issue?²
 And many more similar questions.³
 - Long term, this content analysis process will allow ARC to adapt the tool for auditing home health companies in Knox County, and to share it with long term care and home health organizations throughout East Tennessee.




Methodology

Using a methodological approach inspired by **Bharat Mehra and Rebecca Davis's research⁴** and a content analysis form adapted from the **HRC and SAGE's Long Term Care Equality Index**,⁵ we...

Consulted housing lists provided on the Knox Seniors website and compiled our own list of LTCC websites and social media platforms for analysis.


Split up the list between our two group members and completed our content analyses.

Our Findings


Overall, most LTCCs **did not have information readily accessible online** to meet the unique information needs of LGTBQ+ older adults.

Conclusion

- LTCCs in Knox County, TN must make **pragmatic changes** to their websites and social media presences to better meet the information needs of LGBTQ+ older adults.
- ARC can easily adapt our content analysis process to **audit home** health companies in Knox County.
 - ARC will share our process with LTCCs and home health organizations throughout East Tennessee.
- A future practicum group might be able to assess how LTCCs in Knox County meet the information needs of LGBTQ+ older adults **in offline contexts**.


